Fellow Bryantites:

I know you are interested in what we who are overseas are doing, but censorship allows us to say but very little. However, I can say that after three years in the tropics I am now stationed somewhere in England. So far, I've met one other Bryantite, Sgt. Frank Budlong who was in my class ('37).

We are paid in English money and therefore, of necessity, had to learn their monetary system in a hurry. Although I was only in the U. S. a little over two months before coming overseas again I saw the rationing in the Middle West and the East and it can't begin to compare with that over here. Even in the Army we are rationed to 7 pks. of Cigarettes, 2 bars of Sandy, one pkg. of cookies, 1 bar of soap, 2 boxes of matches, 2 razor blades, and 1 pkg. of gum a week if it is available. We can, and do get the Stars & Stripes (army newspaper) every day and the Yank once a week.

Please let me know what the curriculum and tuition are for the 2-year accountancy course are. Thanking you for this, I remain,
