Bryant's 135th Commencement

McCabe, chairman of Narragansett Electric, will speak at Graduate School Commencement on Friday, May 15, at 4 p.m. Both commencements will take place under the tent behind the Bryant Center.

Taylor and McCabe will receive honorary degrees from Bryant, along with: Dr. Morris J.W. Gaebe, chairman of the board and chancellor, Johnson & Wales University; and Ernest E. Stempel, director and senior advisor - Life Division, American International Group, Inc. Bessie Jae Clanton, civil rights activist, Urban League leader, and Bryant Trustee, will be honored posthumously with a Doctor of Humane Letters at undergraduate exercises. Bryant marketing team snap, crackle, and pop their way to second place in national competition

udos to six Bryant marketing students who earned second place in the finals of a national marketing competition in Dallas last weekend. The team was one of eight finalists in the American Marketing Association (AMA) Marketing Challenge, the third time a Bryant team has made the finals since 1995.

Eight finalists teams were chosen from among 27 colleges and universities in the initial competition, which challenged the students to create a marketing plan for The Kellogg Company that would help them penetrate the lucrative recreation market that accounts for food and snack purchases made outside of the supermarket. The finalists were chosen based on written analyses submitted to the AMA and Kelloggs in February.

The Bryant team began working on their marketing plan in early January during semester break, logging in 60 to 70 hours each week. The team included five undergraduate students: seniors Tracy Bolduc, Jacqueline Longtin, and Vincent Sullivan; juniors Brian Willinsky and Barry Yackolow; and graduate student Jeffrey Teixeira. Professor Frank Bingham served as faculty advisor. (Look for a photo in the May issue of *Bryant Exchange*.)

At the competition, the teams each made a 30-minute presentation, followed by a 15-minute question and answer session to defend their case.

Rogers University (formerly Northeastern State University) in Tulsa, Oklahoma, placed first in the competition. Behind the Bryant team followed Cleveland State University, Ohio; Loyola University, New Orleans; Ohio University; St. Cloud University, Minnesota; Stephen F. Austin State University, Texas; and University of Hawaii in Manoa.
