



The scoring play came on a great catch by Ted Alsop on a 20-yard pass from Ed McMannus. Beta handled the ball better than they had against Chi Gam, but they were unable to click for the big 6-pointer. AOX now has a record of 1-1 while Beta is 0-2.

The KT defense line kept constant pressure on Phi Sig quarterbacks, Dave Benevides and Ivan Purdy, and Phi Sig was never able to mount a serious scoring attempt. KT is now 2-0 and Phi Sig is 1-1.

Intramural Sports Review

The current intramural sports program is an extensive one in that there are nine activities offered: touch football, badminton, tennis, volleyball, bowling, basketball, softball, table tennis, and horseshoes. These sports are not exclusively for the men on campus, but there is also competition in every sport except touch football between teams made up of women dorm students.

Through the direction of Mr. Camper and his assistant, Bruce Vitner, referees are chosen, schedules are made up, and suggestions and complaints are considered. Acting as a go-between for the students and administration consumes much of Mr. Camper's time. Any suggestions

as to how to improve a present sport or introduce a new sport should be discussed with Mr. Camper, although expansion of intramurals is rather difficult because of the limited space available. Many sports which Bryant would like to offer its students conflict in season and facilities, such as soccer and football, or wrestling and basketball. If enough students are interested and make their interest known, Mr. Camper is definitely considering forming intramural golf matches.

Exercise and physical fitness are scarce around the Bryant campus only if the individual student wants it to be that way, for there is ample opportunity to participate in a sport to suit everyone's abilities.

Harriers Beat Sacred Heart, Tie Nichols

On Saturday, October 15, 1966, the Bryant College Cross Country Team traveled to Bridgeport, Connecticut, for a dual meet with Sacred Heart University. Running with only five harriers, the Indians, led by Bill Stanton and Al Levis, jumped to an early lead which they never relinquished. Following Stanton and Levis across the finish line at the end of the 4.5 mile course were Gary Underwood, Bob Coleman, and Manny Coloura. By sweeping the first five places in this race, the team turned in its finest performance of the season and raised its record to 2-4. With Sacred Heart getting the next five places, the score of the meet was Bryant 15, Sacred Heart 40.

Tuesday, October 18, 1966, saw the same team travel to Portland, Maine, for a triangular meet with the Portland branch of the University of Maine and St. Francis College of Biddeford. Fine performances by both St. Francis and U. Maine could not quite be matched by Bryant as the Indians lost to U. Maine: 22 to 35, and to St. Francis: 24 to 33. Bill Stanton finished third and Al Levis finished sixth.

This past Saturday, Nichols College was host to Bryant for a dual meet on their extremely hilly 4.5 mile course. Again with only five men, Bryant gained a tie, 28 to 28, with the same team which only two weeks before had beaten them 24 to 31. Running a very determined race, Bryant put Bill Stanton, Al Levis, and Gary Underwood in the second, third, and fourth positions, Manny Coloura, eighth and Bob Coleman eleventh. While the final score was a tie, the result must be interpreted as a real victory for the Bryant team.

The team is now looking forward to November 5 when they will meet Barrington and New Haven at Barrington.

Jacobs Library Growing Rapidly

The Library acquired a good deal of new steel shelving this past summer. This new shelving, on every floor of the Library, is already filled with new books and has already become part of the background. The periodical room has been equipped with the very latest steel shelving. This shelving is partly shelving and partly storage, and provides access to the latest issue of each periodical, as well as back issues in the storage section of the same shelf. The new pole cabinets for newspapers is the latest equipment in the field also. Another important addition is the steel sections for periodical indexes with pull-out shelves that the students may use for taking notes. The Library and the librarians are very happy with all this new equipment and hope that the students will find it helpful.
