the wild blue yonder.

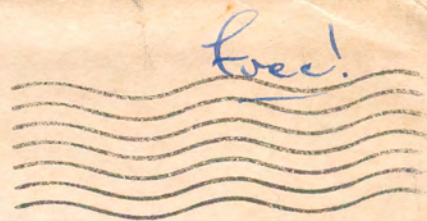
I love you, and think of
