Q&A with Dick Capobianco '53 and Judy Mastronardi



Dick Capobianco '53, Alumni Association president, and Judy Mastronardi, director of alumni relations, discuss the success and vision of the Alumni Association's strategic plan. The plan includes initiatives to strengthen alumni relationships with the college, such as a community service program, benefits and services, and improved communication strategies.

Q: Why did the Alumni Association identify community service as a desirable method of involving alumni?

Dick: The feedback I've received from alumni indicates a high degree of interest in community service. This is a way for graduates to strengthen their ties to their local community in the name of their alma mater. Another nice thing about community service is that it involves alumni of all ages and their families.

Judy: The truth is, a lot of people are turned off by strictly social events. They want to invest their time in worthwhile efforts. Volunteer service promotes goodwill and offers a chance for alumni to be involved citizens in their communities.

Q&A (continued)



Q: What has been accomplished so far?

Judy: First, we developed a manual that chapters can use to start their own community service

programs. The Rhode Island Alumni Chapter is the first group to put it to use; they'll serve as a prototype for other chapters.

The first event is the May 6 Special Olympics. Members of the Rhode Island Chapter will organize games and support athletes. Then, in April 2001, the chapter is working with The Healing Co-op in Portsmouth, RI, an organization for women with breast cancer, to coordinate a Walk for Breast Cancer.

Q: What feedback have you received from alumni about the Community Services program?

Dick: Alumni have responded that they want to convey the spirit of our college by helping others.

Q: What is the Benefits and Services program?

Dick: The benefits and services that we offer alumni include a free subscription to the alumni magazine, competitive fees to the Jarvis Nautilus Center, access to one of the region's most comprehensive business libraries, Career Services resources, and more. We have long had these benefits and services for our alumni, but we haven't been aggressive enough in getting the word out. One of our current goals is to better communicate what is available to Bryant graduates. For the future, we're reviewing discount travel programs, long distance telephone packages, credit cards, insurance, educational programs, and other ideas. We also plan to utilize our Web site to provide a lot of information.

Judy: We want to connect alumni to Bryant and give them an opportunity to feel good about their alma mater. We want to offer them better

services than what they could obtain elsewhere. We have the resources: so many Bryant alumni are in various businesses, and have expertise we can pass on to members.

But it's just as important that we do this carefully, and not bite off more than we can chew. Still, we've received positive feedback from council members that we are accomplishing great things and people are enthusiastic about that.

Q: The strategic plan makes a point of exploring ways to bring alumni back to campus. Why is that so important?



Judy: Many people don't realize how Bryant continually improves its facilities, technology, and programs, so it's important to show alumni how their school is growing.

Q: What are some of the recent events at which alumni participated?

Judy: This fall, we provided alumni tents at the four home football games, which offered a central point for graduates to meet. Buzz Waltman '76 organized a small reunion which drew alumni who hadn't been back to campus in awhile. Now they want to do this every year. By that and other accounts, the tents were very successful. By the end of the season we had to enlarge the size of the tent due to the increase in numbers. That was a significant breakthrough because occasions like that reinforce the ties people have with the College – they get to reminisce about what they often describe as the best four years of their lives, while learning more about Bryant's direction.

Dick: Most alumni want to be involved in some way, whether it's participating in the community service or student mentoring programs, or

attending annual meetings. When alumni are involved with the college, they care about its direction and they want to be a part of it.

What renewed my excitement about Bryant was when, six or seven years ago, I learned that I could start my own scholarship fund. Since then, each year I am pleased to provide for a deserving student to get a Bryant education. I meet with the students and talk about their goals and dreams. This experience has become very important to me and my wife. And this is something you don't know about until you get involved with the College. We need to reach Bryant alumni who have attained a certain amount of success and encourage them to give back to the community and to help others. The satisfaction you receive is very rewarding.

Q: What does the future hold for the Alumni Association?

Dick: The major goal of the strategic plan is to attract enthusiastic alumni who are willing to get involved. In the past few years, Bryant has made a strong commitment to the Alumni Association, giving us the chance to reach out in new directions. It's now up to all of us to advance to the next level of association programs.

Judy: From what we've heard from National Alumni Council members, people are recharged with the development and implementation of the strategic plan. Alumni are noticing the improvements; we can tell from responses about the 1999 reunion and last year's events.

Dick: The enthusiasm of our alumni will dictate the success of our programs. I'm happy to say that the future of the Alumni Association is very bright.
