Dear Bryant Service Club:

I just received your very welcome letter with the addresses of my former college friends who are in the service. I was, however, very sorry and somewhat puzzled to hear that you had not received a letter from me as I did send one, but let me thank you again for your kind and generous gift.

I have been transferred to another base since I last heard from you. I am now stationed at the Amherst Air station. I'm getting some flying time in now. I have 14 hours solo and 26 dual. I am due to leave here for Chapel Hill in another month but before I do I may get a leave. If I do I shall thank you in person.

I received a yearbook from the college and I was only wishing that I had been able to graduate also.

A college degree is not only good after the war but it helps a great deal in the service.

I saw Lt Shore picture in it. Perhaps I shall get a chance to see him

sometime.

I am taking my final examinations in aerology, navigation, communications air craft engines and aircraft recognition tomorrow and the next day.

We fly up here seven days a week and we have night classes every 40 night except Sunday during the day we have Physical training and military training so you can see I have very little time to myself.

I must end now and get back to the books. Thanks again for everything.
