Your letter of March 15th arrived last week and it sure gave me a great deal of pleasure to receive it.

I have been in the Service since August, and have been stationed here in Virginia since Oct. 10, 1942. I've been connected with this Amphibious Force ever since it opened here.

I am working with the International Business Machines such as Calculator, Interpenter, Reproduce and Key Punch, which is somewhat like an electric typewriter. You see we make all report of Changes for this Amphibian Training Program for this Eastern Seaboard.

You may know what this Force did a few months ago over in Africa, well you see just what our Commanders are doing
