Description of stone's condition:

Stone number two sits in the middle of the three headstones. It seems to be in fair condition and is a bit taller than stone number one. The initials on this stone corresponds to the two people who were buried under stone number three. There is lichen growth about halfway down the stone with dirt adhering to the stone. The stone sits alone with no plate at the base. There are three-leaf clovers growing around it along with rocks and twigs.

Description of stone's condition:

Stone number one is the closest to the path leading to the cemetery. It has a chip along the top of the stone but seems to be in fair condition. There is dirt adhering to the stone along with some lichen growth. In the writing on the stone it appears that two letters in the third line are faded and hard to depict due to the effects of acid-rain. There is no plate that this stone stands on and is surrounded by rocks, twigs, and dirt.
