However this morning there are only four of us left in the Carrachs to et is very quiet. We never know how much time red are going to have before being called out again so it is hard to start to do anything which can't be julaway in a hurry Kesterday Morning we got up at six o'clock got dressed + lined up outside by 6. 25. after rolleall we had will ten minutes of 7 to make up our he is sweep the floor, + dust after breaklas Lay and he had to take all our cots outdoors + pull them all apart again From 9 to 11.30 we all to the lesting building and took first a General tilelligence test next, a mechanical applitude test, I third a Chrical applitude test, Wish & knew

how I did on them, bal I don't think we are ever told. afterdimer, our group got mops, browns thails + scrubbel the barracks floor, More fun! Really not bod at all when everyone is doing it after that we went to the classification Building where we were interviewed as to what we want to do and all about our desiness experience, etc. The girl who interviewed me was very rice. I think now that I shall apply for officer Candidate & chool, she said there was a Chance to apply about two weeks frome Now. If I don't get it immediately after Basic Training I'll be put in any office Some where which will be all right with We are stell at the Reception Center, hoping to get some army clothes this Pyjamas. Boy is it cold until about 11 o block in the moning.

Right now the four of us left here in barrasks are huddled around the coal stone, "Junior" trying to beep warm. fastevening some afthe girls from the other barraches came in and we Sang song until about 8.30, Then I goot undressed + went over to the wash room (which is called the latrice) and took a shower before going to bed. This morning we have made our leads + got ready for inspection and then most of those in the barracks went to get their clothing. I leglad when I get to our regular Garracks + startour basic training with a definite time schedule how all we do is hang around of want for whatever is going to liappen next. It is the same group of girls. Most of them are very nice

not busy, but that is to be expected and I don't let it take away my enjoyment afthere hew experiences. Hat shows quite well what we are and will be doing. Perhaps you'd be interested in what We are having to eat, I'll give you some of the nemes of Nean remember what we've had,
This morning there was, eggs, sausage meat, pep, muffets, viscients, marmalade, Coffee, oranges, you took what you Wanted, This is the usual treaffact, although sometimes there is cooked cereal instead of dry, grapofruit instead buseuits, + sometimes there is nich enough to have some to drive.

Last right - Beef stew, (very good) cinnamon buns, asparagus o spinach, apple salad, coffee. one noon - baked potators + ham, carrot bread + cake r coffee, I can't remember the others but they'reall tasty and well prepared. I think of you after. Love to all of you, Kay.



P.SS. I zustread your letter again. There is one hour defference in time. We Let our Watches back when we got tour camp. I don't med those slacks now, and no one work them on the train afterall. I guess I forgot to mention fleat & really got a big thrullout of fraving and Ruth + Uncle Walter on the train. That must have been some snows torm! I am not going to be able to to much I mas Shopping Samafraid. There is nothing here on the Post + we can't go into charanouga for a couple weeks teven when we so get a chance to 90 probably the stoves will be closed. I'll have to make letters to I'm afraid. Don't send the Stocking, I have plenty - Use them yourself. The clypping were interesting " fore again Kay.
