



The HELIN Library Catalog (helin.uri.edu) features book reviews from a variety of publications, including *Library Journal*, *Publishers Weekly*, and *Kirkus Reviews*. Choose a book title from your list of search results to find reviews and more. If it sounds like a good pick, click the "Request it" button or stop by the library to check it out! An example from the catalog:

***Booklist Starred Review*:** "Born and raised in the Mount Hope section of Providence, Rhode Island, journalist Liam Mulligan won't simply report on the rash of arsons killing lifelong friends and loved ones in his old neighborhood. He wants to know more and launches an investigation, discovering a heavy-handed plot to own Mount Hope in order to redevelop it. Along the way, he's threatened, beaten, arrested on suspicion of arson and murder, suspended from his newspaper, and targeted with a Mob contract on his life. Mulligan must turn to some unlikely allies to save his tired old neighborhood and secure justice... Debut novelist DeSilva began a four-decade career in journalism as a reporter for the Providence Journal, and his take on the city and state is harsh but also affectionate... Andria Tieman's Take: ALA New Orleans

This past June, I was honored to serve on a panel at the American Library Association's annual conference, held in New Orleans. The panel's topic was "The Side Gig: How to Supplement your Income in Tough Economic Times," and it featured six presenters. I shared a few of the money-making schemes I'd come up with after finishing library school and fully realizing the state of the economy. I had first heard about the panel when a friend emailed me about it, commenting, "this is perfect for you!" I contacted the organizer, who said she would love to have me, and I started putting together my talk.

As the conference approached, I started seeing the name of the program cropping up in other library publications. The Hack Library School blog recommended it, as did *Library Journal*. Although that was nerve-wracking, it was also indicative of how important the message of the program was to so many under- and unemployed librarians out there.



Overall, the panel was a lot of fun. My fellow panelists had a wide array of experiences, so it didn't feel like we were repeating ourselves; we received good questions and feedback from the audience; and a few people came up to me afterward to say how helpful it was. I give the experience two very enthusiastic thumbs up!
