I've already written you that the cigarette arrived O.K. but want to thank you now for the letter. It arrived a few days ago along with about twenty other letters, and believe me they were a welcome sight. You see, I've been laid up in the hospital for a few days and my mail has been held up somewhere, and when you are in the habit of receiving it daily, you miss it when it is delayed.

I don't know if the "Battle of Miami Beach" is too much for me or whether I just don't live right, but here I am at the Miami Biltmore in Coral Gables. It has been purchased by Uncle Sam and now used as a hospital for Air Corps men — and what a lay-out! I'm

having a wonderful time here and don't care
whether I get back to duty or not. We have
a theatre, 18-hole golf course, three swimming pools,
P.X., etc. It's actually a city in itself. Reminds
one of Grand Central Station.

Thanks to the Red Cross there is never
a dull moment around here — always something
doing — movies, shows, fishing parties, hot-
dog roasts, all kinds of games and sports,
dancing, etc. The Red Cross is really doing
a marvellous job for the boys.

Well, outside of what I've already
said there isn't much news around a hospital
so I'll close now with very best wishes to
you all.
