RELEASE ON ARRIVAL

A new classroom building, expanded Library and Placement Bureau facilities, await the 1578 students, including 649 freshmen, when Bryant College begins its 99th school year with registration on Wednesday, September 6. 1960

Kilcup Hall, the newly constructed classroom building at 148 Hope Street, will open its doors for the first time this week. The Henry L. Jacobs Library will now be housed in the renovated Simonds estate, at 128 Hope Street, which has been converted to this purpose.

Individual Conference Rooms for Visiting Personnel Directors, who recruit Bryant graduates for their training programs, and a new Occupational Library, containing job-reference material and company literature, have been added to the Placement Bureau located on the northwest corner of the campus.

The 1961 entering class of 649 Freshmen represents 14 states. Of these 365 are men and 284 women. Together they bring the total campus population to 1578 students.

The 550 out-of-town students will arrive on Tuesday, a day ahead of registration, to get settled into their dormitory rooms. A special program has been arranged for this day with College Deans and Officers welcoming students. Out-of-town students and their parents are invited to a Buffet Meal which will be continuous from noon to 7:00 p.m. in the Jacobs Dining Hall.

Actual registration will begin at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday morning. In the afternoon all dormitory freshmen will be taken on Guided Tours of the campus. Following the tour, they will assemble in the College Auditorium for a reception.

Classes begin on Monday, September 11.
