

The Henry L. Jacobs Library A Major Addition to Bryant

Part of the Bryant College expansion program, the Henry L. Jacobs Library building, is now a smoothly-functioning reality. Its four large classrooms, teachers' lounge, and spacious library are in constant use. The walls and ceilings are painted in soft pastel shades with blond woodwork completing the decorative scheme throughout the building.

Our new librarian, Miss Dorothy E. Keith is hard at work cataloging and shelving new books. Miss Keith, following faculty and administration recommendations, is purchasing basic business-reference books and periodicals as fast as they can be catalogued.

Initial contributions of \$2,200 for the purchase of books were received from the Student Senate Library Fund; \$5,000 was received from Bryant College Board of Trustees and from appropriated college funds.

Know Your Faculty



PROF. GEORGE A. RICHARDS

George A. Richards, Professor of Salesmanship and Advertising, is celebrating his 25th Anniversary as a Teacher and Administrator at Bryant College. Professor Richards has been associated with the College in a variety of capacities. In its early days, in addition to teaching, he combined in his person the offices of Director of Public Relations, Registrar and Director of Student Activities not to mention Alumni Secretary. He organized the first Alumni Reunion in the fall of 1936 in the Bryant gym.

Nowadays and for the past twenty years he has been teaching Sales and Advertising. He estimates that he has contributed substantially to the training of 3,000 potential salesmen. Enough of these former students drop in to see Professor Richards to confirm his belief that he has been instrumental in making a good many successful salesmen and also confirm his favorite statement that "the greatest opportunities for making money today are in the field of selling".

Professor Richards' faith in the efficacy of a Bryant education is demonstrated by the fact that two of his children, Virginia and James are both graduates of Bryant. His daughter Virginia graduated in 1946. She lives in Dunallen, New Jersey and has two children. His son James graduated in 1950, is with General Motors and has one child.

Professor Richards has been advisor to Tau Epsilon for twenty-five years and also advisor to the former BA Society—now the Delta Omega fraternity—since it was founded. In the early days he used to take an active part in College athletics both as a player and as a referee.

On weekends the Professor usually heads for Beverly, Mass., the North Shore above Boston, or for Cape Cod where he indulges in beachcombing and fishing. He lives at 101 Leroy Drive in Riverside with his wife Rose and their daughter Donna who is nine years old and in the

SALARY SURVEY

Classes of 1948 and 1949

Dr. Jacobs extends a sincere "Thank you" to all alumni who have answered his form letter and returned the confidential survey cards. A preliminary summary follows:

Of 443 members of the class of 1948—145 men and 69 women indicate approximate salaries as follows: MEN: \$2-3,000 (2); \$3-4,000 (18); \$4-5,000 (29); \$5-6,000 (42); \$6-7,000 (30); \$7-8,000 (10); \$8-9,000 (6); \$10,000 or over (8). WOMEN: Under \$2,000 (2); \$2-3,000 (14); \$3-4,000 (9); \$5-6,000 (1); Housewives (29).

Class of 1949

Of 608 members of the class of 1949—147 men and 44 women returned cards. This survey is still underway. Returns to date follow: MEN \$2-3,000 (1); \$3-4,000 (21); \$4-5,000 (39); \$5-6,000 (46); \$6-7,000 (14); \$7-8,000 (12); \$8-9,000 (5); \$10,000 or over (4). WOMEN: Under \$2,000 (2); \$2-3,000 (11); \$3-4,000 (16); \$4-5,000 (4); Housewives (11).

The survey includes classes from 1945 to 1955. A final detailed report will be issued on its completion.
