

1979-80 Outlook

According to Chinese mythology, 1980 is the Year of the Monkey. But ask Bryant College basketball fans and they'll tell you 1980 definitely is the Year of the Indians.

No one can blame Bryant fans for their optimistic outlook toward the 79-80 season. With nine returning lettermen, including an All-American, the 1979 ECAC Division Two Rookie of the Year, an All-East selection, and three of last year's top New England schoolboy recruits, Bryant fans can't help but be enthusiastic about the 1979-80 campaign.

The combination of veterans and talented newcomers should give coach Lee Drury one of the strongest Division Two teams in the East as he begins his second year at the helm of the Bryant quintet.

Last year, despite a grueling 16-game road schedule, Drury directed the Indians to an 18-10 record highlighted by a berth in the regional ECAC Division II-III tournament.

The entire starting unit from the 78-79 team will be back, led once again by junior All-American Ernie DeWitt.

DeWitt, the New England (all divisions) and ECAC Division Two Rookie of the Year in 1978, gained U.S. Coaches Association All-American honors last year as he led the Indians in scoring, 19.0; rebounding, 9.0; and field goal shooting, .614. His 231 field goals in 376 attempts set a Bryant record for field goal percentage and placed him first in New England and eighth among the nation's top Division Two shooters.

Joining DeWitt once again in the front court will be senior Dan Mazulla, captain of the 79-80 Indians and an All-East selection for the past two years. Mazzulla, like DeWitt, became a member of Bryant's 1,000 Point Club last season, when he ran his three-year collegiate scoring total to 1,020

points. The 6-4, 220-pound Johnston, Rhode Island, native is considered one of the top defensive players in the eastern college-division ranks.

The firepower from the outside, once again, will come from John Mangum. The 6-2 sophomore from Providence captured ECAC Division Two Rookie of the Year honors last season. Mangum was right behind DeWitt in scoring averaging 18.4 ppg in his first year of collegiate competition.

The other two starters from last year's squad back for another season are center Don Sweet and guard Bob Mahon, a pair of juniors. Sweet, who moved into a starting role midway through last season, averaged 10 points per game over the second half of the campaign. The 6-8, 225-pounder possesses an extremely soft shooting-touch for a man his size.

Mahon was the Indians' playmaker last season, averaging seven assists per game. The 5-11, Avon, New Jersey, native followed DeWitt, Mangum and Mazzulla in scoring with a 6.0 average.

Other veterans returning are Bill Yukna, a 6-4 senior swingman from Kensington, Conn.; Bob Corbett, a 6-1 senior guard from Latham, N.Y.; Joe Savickas, a 5-9 junior guard from Providence; and Pete SanSouci, a 6-3 sophomore forward from North Smithfield, R.I.

The three freshmen recruits are Ray "Chip" Venter from Hendricken High in Warwick, R.I., Dennis Verni of Worcester Academy, and Paul Berlo of Scituate, Mass., High.

Venter, a 6-2 swingman, was the Most Valuable Player in the 1979 Rhode Island Class A schoolboy playoffs when he led Hendricken to its first state basketball championship.

Verni, a 6-8 center, led Worcester Academy to the New England prep school title last year with a 24 ppg average. Berlo, a 6-5 forward, was the top scorer and rebounder last year at Scituate averaging 22 points and 14 rebounds per game.

Another bright spot for the Indians this season is the schedule. For the first time since they moved up to the Division Two ranks five years ago, the Indians will have a home court advantage against the teams they are expected to battle for a berth in the regional NCAA playoffs. Included on the ll-game regular season home schedule are contests with Bridgeport, the defending Division Two regional champion, Bentley, Assumption, Quinnipiac, Sacred Heart, and Springfield.

Head Coach - Leon Drury

After six years as assistant coach, Lee took over as the Indians' head coach last season and immediately led them to a post-season tournament.

Despite 16 road games during the regular season, he directed the Indians to a 17-9 record during the regular season, followed by a second place finish in the ECAC regional division two-three playoffs.

Before taking over as head coach and athletic director last year, Lee had served six years as assistant coach and AD. As assistant basketball coach his main responsibilities were recruiting and scouting. The 110-52 record the Indians posted during his tenure as assistant is evidence of his successful work. Among the outstanding players he helped bring to Bryant were the Indians' first two All-Americans, Paul Seymour (1978) and Ernie DeWitt (named last season to the National Coaches Association All-American squad).

A 1966 Springfield College graduate, he was captain of the 1965-66 Springfield basketball team, which recorded the best record in Springfield history, 20-4.

He appeared in the 1966 New England Hall of Fame All-Star game and was a member of the 1965 Springfield team that conducted a 62-day aroundthe-world good will tour on behalf of the U.S. State Department.

lle served as assistant coach for a year at Springfield before becoming the athletic director and head basketball coach at Litchfield, Conn. High.

In two years at Litchfield his basketball team compiled a 36-8 record, highlighted by a berth in the title round of the 1969 Connecticut state championships.

Assistant Coach - Mike McGuinn

This is Mike's third year with the Bryant basketball program. He joined the staff in 1977 on a part-time basis and last season took over as Lee Drury's full-time assistant.

A member of the nationally ranked Providence College Friars for four years, 1967-71, he served as a player-coach for the Fort Monmouth service team for one year and coach the Berlin American High School team from 1972-1974.

Before joining the Bryant staff, he served as an assistant coach at Rhode Island College for two years.

He will take over the scouting and recruiting duties which Lee Drury performed for the past six years.

In addition to his basketball duties, Mike also serves as head baseball coach and assistant athletic director.
