DOCTOR OF LAWS (LL.D.)

CHARLES SAWYER

Secretary of Commerce of the United States

Mr. Sawyer, a native of Cincinnati, Ohio, was educated in the public schools of that city and received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Oberlin College in 1908. In 1911 he was awarded the Degree of Bachelor of Laws from the University of Cincinnati. He was admitted that same year to the bar in Ohio and elected to the City Council of Cincinnati. Commissioned a Captain of the Infantry in World War I, he served with the American Expeditionary Forces and was honorably discharged with the rank of major in 1919. He was Lieutenant-Governor of Ohio in 1944 and was appointed Ambassador to Belgium and Minister to Luxembourg by President Roosevelt in 1944. Secretary Sawyer is a trustee of Oberlin College, a member of prominent clubs of Cincinnati and the Ohio Society of New York City. He was appointed Secretary of Commerce by President Truman and took office May 6, 1948.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (D.S. in B.A.)

MRS. NELLIE TAYLOE ROSS Director of The United States Mint

Born in St. Joseph, Missouri, Mrs. Ross was educated in both the public and private schools there. In 1925 Mrs. Ross was elected Governor of the state of Wyoming to fill the unexpired term of her husband, William Bradford Ross, who died while in office. She was the first woman to become governor of any state in the United States and the first woman to become Director of the United States Mint. She was appointed by President Roosevelt in 1933, reappointed by him in 1938 and 1943 and by President Truman in 1948. At the end of her fourth five-year term she will have served twenty years as Director of the Mint. She is a lecturer of distinction and a writer of magazine articles.

DOCTOR OF SCIENCE (D.Sc.)

WILLIAM D. FALES Head of the Textile School and Chairman Textile and Clothing Division, Rhode Island School of Design

A native of Rhode Island, Mr. Fales was educated in the schools of Central Falls and East Providence. He is a graduate of the Rhode Island School of Design and holds an honorary degree of Master of Science from the Rhode Island College of Pharmacy and Allied Sciences. He has made surveys of Textile Education in the United States and Canada, collaborated in the preparation of a text on Cotton Manufacturing and was Scientific Consultant for the Technical Industrial Intelligence Committee of the War Department with assignments in England, Germany, Austria and France to survey Textile Education in 1945. Mr. Fales is the author of laboratory manuals in elementary and advanced textile design. In 1949, he visited England and Switzerland to survey Textile Education and later, Apparel Design in France. He is a member of leading textile organizations, civic, professional and cultural groups.

DOCTOR OF EDUCATION (D.Ed.)

LUCIUS A. WHIPPLE

President, Rhode Island College of Education

Dr. Whipple was born in Harmony, Rhode Island. He is a graduate of the Rhode Island School of Design, Rhode Island State College and received his Master of Arts Degree at Brown University. Honorary degrees have been conferred upon him by the Providence Catholic Teachers' College, Rhode Island College of Pharmacy, Rhode Island State College and Providence College. Formerly a teacher at the Abbot School, Farmington, Maine, the Pawtucket High School, Superintendent of Schools for the Town of Lincoln. Rhode Island, Principal of Pawtucket Senior High School, he is now President of the Rhode Island College of Education. At intervals his educational work has ben interrupted while he became Superintendent of the Rhode Island State Home and School for Dependent and Neglected Children; the Director of Surveys and Research, Rhode Island State Department of Education and Executive Secretary of the Pawtucket and Blackstone Valley Community Chest.
