Alumni Annual Giving Tops \$10,000



The receipt of a \$1000 gift pushed the 1964 Alumni Annual Giving Fund to an excess of \$10,000 at the end of May. General Chairman Bob McGivney said, "It's exceeding our expectations for our first year and we have until the end of June to complete our work."

When the total topped the mark, 742 alumni had returned a contribution.

The hard work of Class Chairmen and Class Agents is behind this exceptional total, which compares with a previously high total of \$1,974.

The Class of 1939 added to their previous gifts by the amount of \$72. This additional gift was announced at a dinner and reunion meeting May 22 at Johnson's Hummocks Restaurant.

It is significant that so many former students are accepting this invitation to support their college. The College is administered entirely under a Board of Trustees and has increased its physical holdings considerably in the past five years.

If you are in the vicinity of the College, you are invited to stop and visit. We would be pleased to take you on a tour of the campus and show you the many fine improvements that have changed the complexion of the College, perhaps since you were in school.

Your participation gift to the Annual Giving Fund need not be a large one, but we would like to hear from you before the program comes to a close on June 30.

PRESIDENT JACOBS RECEIVES LL.D.

RHODE ISLAND COLLEGE CONFERRED THE DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF LAWS UPON PRESIDENT E. GARDNER JACOBS AT COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES HELD JUNE 6.

Dr. William C. Gaige, President of Rhode Island College, read a citation, which is quoted in part below:

"You are the epitome of the good and faithful servant. For 43 years you have given your life to the growth and improvement of Bryant College . . . and you have contributed time and ability far beyond that of most to the community affairs of Providence and the State of Rhode Island.

. . . you have devoted an urgent vitality to the improvement of Bryant's curriculum, faculty, and housing of its Library and teaching facilities . . .

Founded within a decade of each other, our Colleges have spent a century growing up together—a century of war and peace, boom and depression, and political upheaval. That we have shared these many seasons together gives us a special affection and regard for Bryant College . . .

Gardner Jacobs . . . Rhode Island College honors you and Bryant College today . . . I confer upon you the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws with all of its rights and privileges . . ."

Notes of regret were received from Miss Clara Blaney, Mrs. Blanche Stickney, Mrs. Louise B. Messer, and Mrs. Kathleen Krueger Mullin.

President Jacobs addressed a group of alumni in the auditorium, outlining the progress made in the last decade and commenting on future plans, including the additional classrooms planned for Memorial Hall and the new women's dormitory.

A special surprise awaited Richard Bliss '02. Mrs. Bliss, who is Town Clerk in Rehoboth, Massachusetts, had informed Alumni Secretary Ken Cedergren that Homecoming Day would be Richard's 80th birthday. A specially decorated cake was on hand to commemorate the occasion. President Jacobs

ADMISSIONS APPLICATIONS INCREASE GREATLY

Dr. Paul G. Buchanan, Director of Admissions, has reported that his office has received an increase in applications this year, comparable to the increase at most other colleges.

"Not only have we received an increase in the number of applications, but also we have received them much earlier in the year" he reported.

This means that the Freshman Class was formed in early March and that the applications received since then were too late to be considered by the Admissions Committee. The class will total 650 students, with 58 percent majoring in business administration, 14 percent in teacher education, and 28 percent in secretarial studies.

All indicators for next year point to an even greater number of applications. If there are students you know who are interested in Bryant, it would serve them well if you will advise them to submit their applications in the early fall.


