Sun 27 aug [1944] 6 00 PM.

Pear Folks, What a change in the weather! We have shwered all day + all last night, It is just 68 in the barracks this vienute and we've all got sweaters on, and love it! Marjorie + I went to the movies triday niglet and saw "famie" Don't miss et for light entertainment. Dot t Beverly especially willenjoy it. off. It was raining but we thought We't go in town about 3,30 rship + have supper. So we decided to rest a while after hunch. We crowned into bed and when it quieted down after the gang went back to work, we both

went sound asleep and never woke up until 4.30 - Were we surprised! So we at early chow here and then went to town. I bought boxes of candy for the boup for xmas. I thought it would be better than trying to find small eters to fell boxes, I bought four of one kind (Recan patties) + one for Phil cheeseman of assorted candies so that Philot Roger's Would not be the same. That will take care of Craig, Text Bob also. after we shopped we went to a Show "Meet the People" - not God but holling to rave about. I didn't get up until noon today. after dunner marjoriet I talk an hour's walk in the woods they supper. So you see it has been a quiet week end.



We are going to have a terms court rightout back of the barracks. It ought to be done in about a week. I think I'll trunga new rocket No! Wellyou send mine to me immediately. Seems if it could be sent by parcel post O.K. I believe the case + press are already on it. If I find after I try it that it still doesn't suit me, then I'll see about buying I new one and I'll have the case tyress

I'm trigung to finish this as I set in the barracks day room. There are only 7 of as here with Le radio going and Tomme Wasserman is reading all the letters we've written to her sister who is a WAC in Italy. It's hard to concentrate! We just heard a broadcast from Paris. It Makes one feel queer to think how wonderful, shey must feel in Paris tonight,

I bought some pears last night. The first of the season, my but they certainly taste I swell, Just think Jabor Day is a week from tomorrow. Does I seem possible that the summer is practically over? Thank goodness, the heat basn't been as bad as we expected. I believe I could get used to living down here, OK. but I certainly don't want to have to get used its Must stop now,
