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Monday 8.00 PM. Sept 11, 1944 Dear Folks, Sam writing at a table in the Camp Shary. It is rice & quest + cool here. It has rained for three or four day how, but it is a gentle rain and is a relief from the hot weather, However it doesn't help the Sal evening Wayonies I went to see Bride by Mistake" & nice light consedy. Sunday we got up early (Marjone, Ina Welson & J and got the 70 clock been to Macon; had waffles to loa; + then god the & a clock bus for atlanta. The weather was drizzly but we had a fine time in sple of it we reached atlanta about 11.30. We walked all, around the business district, window skopping Lucky the stores were closed I guess or I'L' have spent too week money for a restaurant

that looked vice, we met one of the Station Complement WACs who had been in allanta two weeks studying al Fort MacPherson, She was soglad to see someone she knew! She helped us to get a streetear out to a restaurant called "The Pig'n whistle" which said she had found to have the best food of any she had bried. We had a delicious stook dung for 1.25. Really good - stock, peas, french fries, carrots, rolls, salad, chickensory, tea rice cream. after dinner we went to the Fox Theatre It is some place, Gorgeons. The ceiling is twinkling stars + Floating clouds. It is a large place. It is as it in the courtyand of a coattle will lighted twhrend windows high up on each side. The curtain across the front of the stage was very beautiful lapestry. But best of all is the organ. It is, a coording to them, the biggest theatre organ in the

world. The music from it was wonderful. We just wished they'd forget to land the piture and keep on with the playing, Show started and in between shows there was about 10 minutes of community singing and then be played 'The Long of India! Beautifully done.
