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Letter Written by Katherine Trickey to Her Folks Dated March 28, 1945

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28 Mar 1945. 2.00 PM. Dear Folks, It is quiet in the office today and we are all caught up for the moment, I am very sleepy but I'll try to finish this without actually dropping off. I had a nice day Sunday - Got up for breakfast Then washed - then played 3 sets of tennis with Drake - Got terribly beaten of course but it was lots of fun. - Donald Soodness from Brewer, who is most thru his training here, came up to the WAC Messhall for dinner with me. He seemed to enjoy it. and I'm glad I could have him. He will be going overseas Very shortly. Mary + I went to see Sonja Heinie's Palest Picture. Some very good technicolorscenes.

but a rather cheaper plot and picture Han. her others have been. Monday evening we went to hear Erika Mann, Ce woman war correspondent just back from Europe. She is the daughter of Thomas Mann. She was very interesting with a pleasing personality an able lectures. She has somewhat I an accent as she is a German Refugee, but It was an interesting accent and made her voice more delightful to lesten to. The tolk of her experiences as a war correspondent - the hospilal conditions she had seen - the life she had shared with army hurses - her trip as one of two correspondents to be with DeSaule's party on his trip from Cherbourg to Paris the conditions in the liberated countries - During the question Period at the end, some one asked her to tell us her experience in rescing her father's Manuscript from their home in Germany.

Il seems that when the fireworks started in Germany her father was in Switzerland on a holiday and was unable to go back to Germany She escaped from Germany + their house was Confiscated. Her father had been working on a book that was not completed. He had written it long hand. -She went skring up near the border and skind Over with Germany, When she got to the house and wend in at 1,30 in the morning she found I occupied by SS troops but fortunally Sley were asleep up stairs and she gad the name cupt and gol out the house without waking them. but admitted she was nearly scared to death, she was able to get out of the country again and deliver the book to be father. We god back from Macon about 1AM - then last high I was on deety in the orderly room all night

and didn't 90 to bed until 1.30 and their I slept very little down there - so you can see That I're alle have reason to be sleepy to day. I called the Red Cross last night and asked them to cleck for rue to see if Vera Ferbason if she is able to have visitors, the Major says I may have Monday off to go to see her. I thought She might leke to see some one from home after all this time and it is only a 12th ride each way from here. By the way, I figure foul furloughs here in The office and I'm not going to be able to get Mine until the last of July as far as I know now but nothing to definited and won-t be until the last minute dry way - but I don't see how it can be earlier than that.

V.S I just received a call from the Red Cross Saying that Vera has been transferred to the titzlimmons Leneral Hospital Derwer Colorado. So I shall not be seeing her. They are going I let me know more about her when they So I'll be doing KP hear from there. Sunday instead.
