"It's a Small World," Bryant's Reunion Weekend 1989, on June 9, 10, and 11, will feature international fun and frivolity, as well as a global look at Bryant today.

Bryant's nearly 30,000 alumni now include residents of 19 foreign countries, as well as most of the United States. They have all been invited back to campus to celebrate the College's "Year of International Awareness" during Alumni Reunion Weekend.

From an international hors d'oeuvres buffet on Friday evening to an All-American barbecue on Saturday afternoon and a European breakfast Sunday morning, this year's reunion is certain to be a global gourmet experience. One of the highlights of the weekend will be the international dinner and celebration dance on Saturday evening at which President and Mrs. O'Hara will be honored for their 13 years of service to the College (see related story inside).

Alumnus Plans National Fund Raising Event

David Kelly '83, a Bryant athlete, was involved in an auto accident on August 2, 1987, that left him with no feeling or movement from the chest down. He is one of more than one-half million Americans who suffer from spinal cord injuries. Each year, from 15,000 to 20,000 new cases develop, and two-thirds of these affect people between the ages of 16 and 30.
