Apr 3 1945

Dear Folks,

I got a report from the Red Cross at Fitzsimmons General Hospital, Denver, Colorado, saying that Vera was there for "chest observation - condition not considered serious". I was sorry not to see her and think it is too bad she had to be sent so far from home.

I did get to the Easter sunrise meeting and it was very very nice - a very large crowd, a fine chorus - Chaplain Jack gave a good address - the weather was perfect - warm - and a most glorious sunrise.

KP was not too tough either although we kept busy nearly all day. I did have 2 hrs off in the afternoon and played ~~to~~ three sets of tennis with Drake. I only won 2 games but I played better tennis than I have all this year - she was playing better also ~~so~~ the results were the same as usual.

Last night I practiced baseball and then used Drake's Typewriter to practice typing for about an hour.

This is going to be a busy week -

Tonight is glee club - Tomorrow night I have my hair done at 5.40 - take an Officer Candidate Test at 7.00 - play a basketball game at 9.00 -

~~Wednesday~~ Thurs. we expect to
Broadcast (the glee club) and play
baseball. —

The officer candidate thing doesn't
mean anything except that they
have added a new requirement. It
doesn't mean there are any quotas
to go.

I wish I could see + hear
Bobby. I sounds so cute in all
your letters.

Mother, I like your letters
as you write them. They seem
so real. The longer the better.

Sis, I wrote Bob a V-mail
this week and I'll try to do better
from now on. Love to all
