over. This is a busy place this after noon. There are two games I ping pong going on and both pool tables are in use, There are about so of us using writing deaks and more than 30 others silling reading. May I don drop in here often as the talks who run it are triendly, it is on the street floor so there are no stains to climat and it is not as hoisy as some of the other Service Centers. We found a real pretty rich out to Ingleside that we had never taken before I think it will be come one of our favorities

The other ride was very different, We took a bus that said Fort Hell and if turned out to be a ride practically entirely though the Negro Lection. Houstly, I don't understand why there are not hamible epidemics here the South. The conditions as far as Sanitation is concerned is appalling in the spoor + the nears sections. The houses we saw to day for the most part had no screens at all either in the took or the windows, the yards are cluttered and many had cowst chickens in out building near the house. The toilet facilities are obviously the outhouse Variety and this in a city that has.

running water. and in even the beat sections of towns there are alleyways of negro nomes flatare nothing but shacks. The poorer class of whites hive in homes almost as bad. Many of the presumeably vice homes are little better than our summer cottages. The wealthier homes however are lovely, and those out at Jugleside This afternoon certainly took my eye. have just been playing ping pong with one of the girls from Camp -Must close now in order to mail this before we leave for carry-Fore to all
