Marketing Department Earns an A

The marketing department at Bryant has undergone some significant changes in the past 10 years. The faculty has been upgraded and the curriculum changed to reflect the current industry demands. One such change was the addition of a personal selling class, which allows students to pitch their products while being recorded on video camera. Recruiters find that the students who take this class are regularly the best in their sales training classes, and usually require less sales training.

According to Professor Frank Bingham '61, '72MBA, chair of the marketing department, Bryant has one of the top 10 marketing departments

in the US. There are 11 full-time professors on the faculty and occasionally a part-time member will be added to teach a special course. Seven of these faculty are fairly new members of the Bryant community, having arrived during the last two years. Currently there are about 600 students enrolled with declared marketing concentrations. Even with the popularity of the major, the ratio of students to professors remains around 25 to 1. There are some 20 different marketing courses that a student can choose from. When asked about the marketability of our marketing students, Frank says, "I don't know of any who are unemployed."

Greek Life

The past year has brought some major changes for the Greeks on Bryant's campus. As a result of the study on the future of Greek life done by the Committee on Fraternities and Sororities--a group composed of students, faculty, and administrators--all local Greek organizations have sought national affiliation.

Since spring 1990, three national fraternity chapters have been installed: Delta Chi; Phi Kappa Sigma, formerly Tau Epsilon; and Sigma Phi Epsilon, formerly Phi Epsilon Pi. Since fall 1990, colonies, the first step in becoming a chapter, have been formed by Phi Kappa Tau, formerly Kappa Tau and Delta Kappa Epsilon, formerly Phi Sigma Nu. Beta Sigma Chi and Delta Sigma Chi are seeking affiliation and the three established nationals, Kappa Delta Rho, Tau Epsilon Phi, and Tau Kappa Epsilon remain strong.

Since spring 1990, two national sororities have been installed: Alpha Phi and Theta Phi Alpha, formerly Sigma Lambda Theta. Since fall 1989, colonies have been formed by Sigma Sigma Sigma, formerly Beta Sigma Omicron; Delta Zeta, formerly Sigma Iota Beta; and Phi Sigma Sigma, formerly Alpha Phi Kappa.

The governing body of the Greeks has been divided into the Panhellenic Council for sororities and the Interfraternity Council for fraternities.

The Greek undergraduate population as of spring '90 totals 18% of the student body; and as of fall 1990, involvement in rush has increased 31% over last year's membership. The Greeks remain proud of their local heritage while growing in strength and unity through their national affiliations and increasing involvement in campus life and philanthropic institutions.

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"Alumni Newsletter" Survey Results

Recently the Bryant College Alumni Office conducted a survey to obtain feedback on the quality and impact of the "Alumni Newsletter." Out of the 212 respondents, 90% read the newsletter regularly.

Overall, responses were favorable, particularly stressing that the newsletter is informative, enjoyable, and easy to read.

Most found the content satisfactory. 72% of the respondents would like to see the addition of class notes.

Of those alumni surveyed, the

majority are happy with the title of "Alumni Newsletter."

The three most read articles are Special Events (82%), Reunion (80%), and Calendar (75%).

Responses were first divided into "Old Campus" and "New Campus." From the "Old Campus" (1919-1970) came a 58.01% response and from the "New Campus" (1971-1990) a 40.57% response. Dividing the responses into decades indicates a strong response from alumni in the 1950s and the 1980s.
