A Win-Win Situation



Ernest A. Almonte '78, '85MST

Ernest A. Almonte '78, '85MST has started a unique program to help both students and non-profit organizations. Almonte, a part-time instructor at Bryant College, encourages his students to gain training in their respective fields by volunteering their professional services to needy organizations. The work does not count as part of the students' grades nor are the students paid money for their services.

Almonte, who sits on the boards of several non-profits, recognized the need for financial and computer expertise and lack of funds that constrict many of these organizations. He also saw the need for his students to gain practical experience. Deciding to do something about the situation, Almonte created this win-win situation. "There's more to life than making money," says Almonte who made this project one of his personal goals.

Almonte keeps a close watch on the students' progress. He teaches them

in steps based on what they need to know to do their jobs, and he reviews their work so that there are no major problems.

Almonte's student volunteers learn how to teach their skills to other people. They present exercises on how to do word processing or use Lotus. They teach personal record keeping, budgeting, and banking. They learn and explain that serious budget problems sometimes stem from the budget preparation, not from budget constraints. Students also do basic accounting and maintain general ledger systems.

Almonte has experienced a very positive response from both the students and the organizations that participate in this program. He urges alumni to follow his lead and create more opportunities in which students and needy organizations can both benefit from the Bryant experience.
