Mr. Ferrante has held virtually every volunteer position including: fundraiser, career advisor, Alumni Association Executive Board member and officer, chapter leader, admission representative, reunion chair, and golf tournament planner.

Matthew Boland '61 and William Doherty '68 are the recipients of the 1992 *Distinguished Alumnus Award*, presented annually for outstanding personal achievement. Mr. Boland is noted as the first recipient so recognized for his contribution to government, including his accomplishments as assistant to Elizabeth Dole and Director of the White House Conference on Aging.
