The work goes on (as busy as ever) We'd never know the War was over, I had a vice letter from Jo Dwyer yesterday She is in Charanooga, Term, and is working out on the South Fost at Fort oglethorpe in The Post office. I've mailed many letters t packages in shat Post office. I shant try to see her probably as favy expects to get. I had a coard from Croing but not much News ou it. I'm afraid he is first too far away for us to get to gether.
