Out of the clear blue sky I received your air mail letter dated "12/26th". The mails are definitely "screwy" - don't you think so?

The folks & us in rec'd mail from you, too, but there ~~there~~ is was lots more recent.

We, also, rec'd a Xmas card from the Smiths - T. L., the other son, is on his way overseas. Also - heard from the Bjorkmans!

-- By the way, Mae Spino's son-in-law, Dick Greenbaum is overseas. I haven't had a chance to get in touch with Jane as yet!

Went to sign some papers at the P.O. this a.m. about your Bulova watch. Daggone - because it was in your name, they have to send those "chappy" papers on to you. Well, when you get them, let them out & maybe, some day one of us will have a new watch.

Dad suggested (no fool!) champagne for tomorrow night & so, brought some! I can't wait! Also, I found a

new kind of yells. It's a
"wine flavored" yells. It's
35¢ a package. High, huh?
Well, I'll try it tomorrow
& let you know how it does.
See honey. I had

"champs" all day today.
Can't imagine what I ate or
what's wrong with me!
The minute I finish this
letter I'm going to sleep on
my tummy!
