Two outstanding Bryant faculty members were honored by the alumni association during Reunion Weekend. Professors Judy Barrett Litoff and Mary Lyons received Distinguished Faculty Awards at the dinner and awards ceremony June 10 in recognition of their professional achievements and inspirational involvement with students.

One of the College's most honored faculty members, Litoff has been teaching history at Bryant since 1975. Her genuine interest in her field motivates students to share her involvement, and they describe her as easy to talk to, readily accessible, and greatly admired.

An authority on midwifery, Litoff has published numerous articles and two books on the subject. More recently, she has written "Miss You: The World War II Letters of Barbara Wooddall Taylor and Charles E. Taylor," which she co-authored with University of Maine Professor David Smith. The first of a three-volume series that takes a look at World War II through the lives of ordinary people, the book which will be published this fall is based on the letters exchanged between her aunt and

uncle during this tumultuous time in history.

Litoff holds a PhD from the University of Maine and MA and BA degrees in history from Emory University. Among the Georgia native's community activities are serving as an overseer of the Lincoln and Moses Brown Schools and as a member of the Rhode Island Committee for the Humanities.

A member of the Bryant faculty since 1970, Lyons' field is business communications. A dedicated student advocate, her extensive committee work has involved her in many of the administrative decisions that affect students. Most recently, she served as executive secretary of the search committee for the new president.

Lyons holds PhD and MA degrees in English from the University of Rhode Island, an MBA from Bryant, and a BS in English from Simmons College. She is the co-author of a textbook on report writing for business. Lyons has served on the Rhode Island State Board of Regents and on the boards of the Rhode Island College Foundation and the Community College of Rhode Island Foundation.

Honored at  
Reunion*

Six notable Bryant College alumni were honored June 10 at the annual awards dinner held during Reunion '89. Michael T. Martin '72 received the Nelson J. Gulski '26, '72H Alumni Service Award for his outstanding service to the College and to the Alumni Association. Distinguished Alumni Awards were presented to James M. Gibney '68, Margaret (Wallace) Lawson '53, and Joseph Ravalese Jr. '54 in recognition of their professional achievements and their exemplary service to the community. The recipients of the Bryant College Young Alumni Leadership Awards, presented for the first time this year, were Benjamin L. Edwards '83 and Mano B. Howard '80. They were cited for their creative and responsive leadership in business and industry.

Currently vice president for finance at Payne Elevator Company, Cambridge, MA, previously Martin was chief financial officer of Linemaster Switch Corporation, Woodstock, CT. He is a former Alumni Association president and former alumni representative on the College's Board of Trustees. During his tenure on the board, the College experienced tremendous growth and change, including the transformation of the Koffler Center into a state-of-the-art computer facility and construction of the Multipurpose Activities Center.

Gibney, who began his career as an educator teaching immigrant children to speak English, is now assistant superintendent of schools in Fall River,

MA. He is also an adjunct faculty member at Lesley College and chairman of the Advisory Council to the Dean of Continuing Education at Bristol Community College. Very

active in the community, Gibney has received many honors for his civic activities. He continues to serve on the boards of the March of Dimes, Southeastern Massachusetts Chapter; the Boy Scouts of America, Moby Dick Council; and the Greater Fall River Chamber of Commerce.

Lawson is assistant vice president of marketing at the Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection and Insurance Company, Hartford, CT. Previously, she was vice president and corporate secretary of the Greater Hartford Chamber of Commerce. A director of the Bank of Boston, Connecticut, she is first vice president of Junior Achievement of North Central Connecticut and was International Secretary of the Year in 1965. The first woman member of The Hartford Club, she served as president of that organization from 1983 to 1985.

Ravalese is owner and treasurer of the Tobacco Valley Sanitation Service Company, South Windson, CT. He was formerly executive vice president of the Wooster Express Company. His long and impressive list of community activities includes serving as a trustee of Saint Joseph College, West Hartford, CT., president of the Bryant College Alumni Association, president of the South Windsor Chamber of

Commerce, and president of the Hartford Chapter of UNICO National. Ravalese, who has hosted send-off receptions at his home for many incoming Bryant students, was the founder and first president of the Bryant College Hartford Alumni Chapter.

Edwards, who launched his career in the printing industry in 1983 by using his internship in the Bryant College publications office as a springboard for

implementing his idea of transforming the final issue of the student newspaper, *The Archway*, into a Commencement magazine, received a prestigious national award for this past year's *Archway* Commencement issue printed by his company. The Potlatch Paper Company honored the Edwards

Printing Company, Prospect, CT, for excellence in craftsmanship and creativity for the printing and cover design of the *Archway's* 125th Commencement Magazine.

Edwards and classmate Jerry Schmidt '83 established the Edwards Printing Company in a rented garage after graduation from Bryant, working as production staff, management, and sales force. They now employ 17 people and enjoy a reputation as one of the finest four-color process printers in Central Connecticut.

Howard, president of Bend 'n Stretch, Inc., Hialeah, FL, is responsible for the apparel firm's manufacturing and financial operations. The company operates plants in Haiti and the Dominican Republic as well as in Florida and has a sales office in New York City.

The 2,500 employee multinational company sell its own Baby Luv line of infants' wear to large chain retailers and also manufactures other products for such labels as Izod and Oshkosh B'Gosh. As the third generation of his family to lead the firm, Howard is particularly credited with introducing automated equipment to the company which has experienced 30% to 40% growth in the past four years.
