Dear Folks,

Have had a beautiful day - The weather was wonderful - sunny + warm - Woke up about 9 and read in bed till 1.30 - Had nice fried chicken dinner in the mess Hall at 2 and then went for a long walk in the woods with Mayorie, Minnie and a couple others. We were out all the afternoon and enjoyed ourselves thoroughly. We even found some Pecans to eat.

I am sending my tennis racket and the flat iron + a few other things (in 2 boxes) by Railway Express tomorrow; They'll come C.O.D. I hope they won't be too much. I'm too broke to send any money for them until Wed. pay day! -

The way the work is going I doubt if I get out much before the first of January, but I'm still hoping to get out near the first of December.

Isn't Bob's job just the thing? I
can't think of any that would be better
for him.

You'll miss them all, I know. - but I'll
be home soon so you won't be quite so
lonesome.

This is a hasty letter - there really is
very little news this week.
