##### LOOKING AHEAD

The Bryant College Center for International Business and Economic Development (CIBED) is creating many new and diverse opportunities for students to gain "real world" experience while studying at Bryant, as well as opportunities for alumni to achieve greater business success. The Center presently consists of five arms which extend from the College into the business community: The Center for Management Development, The World Trade Center Rhode Island, The Export Assistance Center, The Institute for Family Enterprise, and The Small Business Development Center.

Established in 1973, the Center for Management Development is a nationally recognized training center which serves more than 8,000 individual, corporate, and non-profit

graduate students intern there, and alumni and Rhode Island businesses may utilize the EAC to learn how to enter the international marketplace, develop marketing plans, and gain specific trade leads.

The Institute for Family Enterprise concerns itself with perpetuating family businesses. Future initiatives include: an Alumni Family Business Academy, Family Business Survival Programs, and increased student internships and field experiences. Currently Bryant faculty are integrated into the programs and a survey course on Family Business Management is offered to students.

Regarded by the federal Small Business Administration as a "flagship" program,

"Student and faculty integration with Bryant's corporate outreach programs makes us unique among business schools," says Director of Corporate Development Cheryl Comai, "The practical experiences CIBED provides students reinforces their theoretical work in the classroom."

At the ninth annual Graduate School Awards Dinner on Saturday, April 24, 1993, John E. Turpin '72, '76MBA will be honored as the 1993 Businessperson of the Year.

John, currently president and general manager of Stanley Air Tools, is no stranger to adversity and hard work. tants, trainers, and teachers. Students act as  
interns and summer conference coordinators.

Bryant is the only private college to house a  
World Trade Center. This franchise links Bryant  
faculty, staff, and alumni to more than 500,000  
members across the globe. Providing trade  
information, research, and a variety of business  
services, it is an important piece in the educa-  
tion of tomorrow's international business lead-  
ers.

The Export Assistance Center (EAC) manages  
the state of Rhode Island's international trade  
activities; offers consulting, training, and infor-  
mational programming; and houses the  
International Trade Data Network. EAC pro-  
grams and seminars are available at no cost to  
students in the MBA program at Bryant, under

Small Business  
Development Center (RISBDC) trained more  
than 2,800 people in 1991-92. There are six  
RISBDCs in the state, all managed by Bryant  
College, which offer a variety of free services to  
their clients. The RISBDC utilizes Bryant faculty  
to research and write journal articles and coun-  
sel clients; engages MBA candidates in "live"  
case studies of and for client businesses; and  
offers a marketing practicum to qualified stu-  
dents.

The Corporate Partners' Program, comprised of  
12 international business leaders, is the market-  
ing and fund-raising branch of CIBED. Having

support and enhance CIBED, Corporate  
Partners' has also produced a promotional video

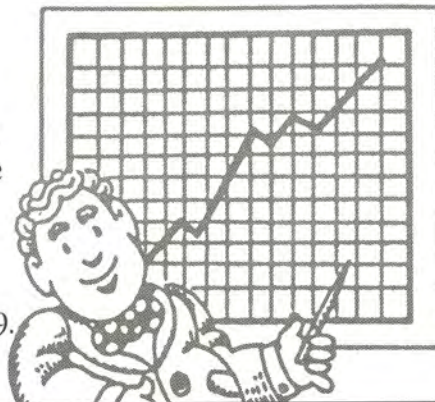
