### (BEST) MEMBERSHIP INCREASING TO MEET DEMAND

The BEST membership has grown to eleven members throughout California. This expansion of membership reflects the dramatic increase in the number of inquiries from high school and community college students throughout the state. California inquiries about Bryant are up 213 percent from last year at this time. As of August, 2,290 California students had inquired about Bryant, whereas last year a total of 731 students had inquired about the college.

### EXPLORING NEW TERRITORIES

Atlanta, California, Chicago, and Florida have been selected as target areas for student enrollment. Unlike the Northeast where the number of high school students has declined, these territories have either maintained or increased enrollment over the last few years. Bryant College has also seen an increasing number of inquiries from high school and community college students from these locations.

Tuition covers only about 70 percent of the cost of educating a student at Bryant College. scholarships, faculty research and teaching projects, library acquisitions, classroom and laboratory equipment and campus maintenance.

Unrestricted dollars are valuable to the college because they can be used immediately for emergency priorities and current needs. These discretionary funds help to sustain the margin of excellence that keeps Bryant at the forefront of educational institutions.

The Annual Fund runs from August 1 through July 31.
