THE CHARLES CURTIS AWARD, \$25, is presented by friends of the College to a student from the Department of Secretarial and Office Education who has manifested courteous conduct and a cooperative spirit in personal relations and demonstrated a capacity for business leadership. This award was inaugurated when the late Mr. Curtis was Vice President of the United States.
