THE JEREMIAH CLARK BARBER AWARD—Fifty dollars to the senior completing a two-year Bachelor's Degree curriculum in the School of Business Administration who has made the most effective use of his native ability in mastering the subject matter of his College program. This award is presented by friends of the College in memory of the late Jeremiah Clark Barber who was Dean of the School of Business Administration, and a member of the faculty of the College for forty-seven years.
