Mr. Arris is a well known authority on financial and industrial business throughout New England. After World War I, he was a customer's man for a hardware firm and also worked with the United Press in the Middle West before returning to New England. During World War II, Mr. Arris headed the price division of the OPA in Rhode Island and originated the Loyal Price Board system

of price control, which was put into effect nationally by the OPA early in the war. He also has served on many regional and national economic policy committees in Boston and Washington. Since Mr. Arris is a well known authority on area business and has traveled extensively for on-the-spot surveys of national business for newspapers, he is in constant demand as a speaker on business and economics. He has made platform appearances and radio broadcasts in all the six New England States. 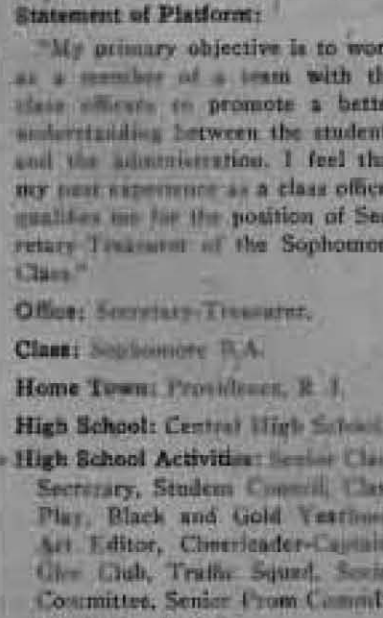

Curtis and Poitier display excellent acting ability, and the supporting players are also responsible for much of the film's impact.

John Wayne is the star of "The Barbarian and the Geisha." This is an unusual film that tells the story of the first diplomatic representative from the U. S. to Japan. Filmed against an authentic Japanese background, the production most skillfully employs unusual pageantry, customs, rites, and dress that are purely Japanese. John Huston's expert direction and an excellent supporting cast are important assets to this picture.

Brief views of coming attractions: "I Married a Monster From Outer Space" is above run-of-the-mill for a science fiction thriller that has a novel and imaginative story idea—very imaginative in fact. "The Fearmakers" with Dana Andrews is a typical espionage melodrama, which occasionally runs to speech-making instead of heroics. "Andy Hardy Comes Home" starring Mickey Rooney is a welcome return of the popular family series. "Hot Car Girl"—no stars, no story, no plot, no good.
