During World War II, Mr. Arris headed the price division of the OPA in Rhode Island and originated the Local Price Board system

of price control, which was put into effect nationally by the OPA early in the war. He also has served on many regional and national economic policy committees in Boston and Washington.

Since Mr. Arris is a well known authority on area business and has traveled extensively for on-the-spot surveys of national business for newspapers, he is in constant demand as a speaker on business and economics. He has made platform appearances and radio broadcasts in all the six New England States. His articles on business and economics have been published in Business Week, Saturday Evening Post, Barron's, and many others.

Producer-director Stanley Kramer is never hesitant about attacking a controversial topic; he has produced such pictures as "The Men" and "The Bold and the Brave." Kramer scores this time with a mighty drama based on the subject of racial conflict. Curtis and Poitier display excellent acting ability, and the supporting players are also responsible for much of the film's impact.

John Wayne is the star of "The Barbarian and the Geisha." This is an unusual film that tells the story of the first diplomatic representative from the U.S. to Japan. Filmed against an authentic Japanese background, the production most skillfully employs unusual pageantry, customs, rites, and dress that are purely Japanese. John Huston's expert direction and an excellent supporting cast are important assets to this picture.
