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## Admiral Kurth Links America With The Soviet Union

On February 28, in the third Bryant Forum of this academic year, Rear Admiral Ronald J. Kurth, president of the Naval War College in Newport, RI, spoke on the subject "Modern Day Soviet Union, Mr. Gorbachev, and the Future of American-Soviet Relations."

Admiral Kurth was introduced by President William T. O'Hara. The 100 person plus audience of "students, faculty, and friends in the community" enjoyed a well prepared and well presented speech by the admiral. Kurth has amassed a wealth of knowledge over his career at Annapolis, Harvard, and in the U.S. Navy that provided a unique viewpoint of the Soviet Union for the Bryant Audience.

Kurth said that Russia has "a history of prosperity, catastrophe, solution and stagnation." Mikhail Gorbachev's new policies, which have accelerated change in the Soviet Union to unprecedented levels, have brought the country to a point from which there is no turning back. Yet "(Glasnost and) Perestroika are candidates for failure," the admiral stated.

Ronald Kurth has a Ph.D. in government from Harvard where he has been a Teaching Fellow in American Government. He was involved in the Incidents at Sea Agreement. Kurth says, "with unabashed pride," that the Incidents at Sea Agreement is one of the most successful military agreements between the Soviet Union and the United States.

Kurth served as the Sixth Fleet commander and later as the Naval Attache in Moscow. Over the past few years, Kurth has visited the 18 cities in the Soviet Union where foreigners are allowed - including "stomping in the back streets and alleyways" - where the "security apparatus" would like to have prevented such consorting.

Mr. Kurth relayed many anecdotes from his own experiences in the Soviet Union. He told his audience that Soviet people have a

tendency towards allegorical jokes. Common Soviet people he met in the street told him jokes like this: "The change of Glasnost is helping! Just two years ago, 2+2 was 7. Now we can call it 5. No, no another would say 5 is to close to 4. Say 6."

Gorbachev's plan has three stages or layers, Kurth explained. Glasnost is the first and the stage the Soviets are in now. Glasnost is a Russian word meaning openness. In the name of Glasnost, there have been many cultural exchanges between



get to see this part of his plan through to its intended end.

Admiral Kurth guessed that Gorbachev's chances for continued success are about 40 percent and dropping. The average blue collar worker in the Soviet Union, Kurth explained, has seen nothing to make him believe in Glasnost.

Perestroika, a book written specifically for Americans is about history in the making by the man who is making it - General Secretary Mikhail Gorbachev. It is available in bookstores and the Bryant College library. The tone of the book is serious and the entire document is well pronounced. If you missed Admiral Kurth this week, check out the book. The admiral's comments were in tune with Gorbachev's strait talk as it is found in Perestroika.

If you did not miss Admiral Kurth, look at how similar Gorbachev handles one point that Kurth made in this quote from Perestroika:

"The new motifs became even more pronounced in comments on the June 1987 Plenary Meeting of the Central Committee. They started admitting that the scale and scope of proposed reforms in economic management surpassed the forecasts of most Sovietologists. We see that many in the West did not expect such frank and in-depth discussion, such large-scale constructive measures. The epithet 'half-way,' which was used to define our activities up to June, seems to have become outmoded when describing the decisions of the June Plenary Meeting and the session of the USSR Supreme Soviet."

The reconstruction (Perestroika) in the Soviet Union is a real reform. Radical changes are taking place. Will it work? Will it last? Read the book.

One of the admiral's goals for his speech at Bryant was to provide fertile subjects "for your thought and for your discussion - for your intellectual growth."

the Soviet Union and the West since Gorbachev took office.

Perestroika is the next layer of Mr. Gorbachev's plan. Perestroika is restructuring. The change called for in this phase is more like reform than a simple restructuring. Admiral Kurth pointed out that reform is a serious situation in a government who's ideology professes that it has the perfect form of government.

The final stage of Mr. Gorbachev's plan is Democratization. It may be, as the name suggests, government reformed to become more democratic. But many analysts believe Gorbachev may not ever

## AIDS Awareness Heightened On Campus

Tuesday, February 28th, was the evening of the AIDS AWARENESS discussion in the Dorm 15 social lounge. This program, the final event of the AIDS Awareness Day, was one of the most popular ones this year, with about 100 people (students, administration, and others) showing up to clear up myths and mistaken ideas about the disease caused by the breakdown in the immune system.

Philip Kane, main spokesman for the program, along with John, a man who was tested HIV-positive this past June, came and spoke about their first hand experiences with the disease and described the feelings and emotions that come along with being tested positive. Philip Kane is main chair-person for the RHODE ISLAND PROJECT FOR AIDS, a community based AIDS service organization with the main purpose of educating Rhode Island about the disease. This organization has an AIDS hot line that is open Monday-Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 8:00

p.m. to answer any questions that the community might have about AIDS.

John, a 39 year old man about 5'6" with dark hair, was diagnosed last June as HIV positive - what HIV stands for is HUMAN IMMUNE DEFICIENCY VIRUS, the virus which causes the body to form antibodies which cannot kill the virus in the immune system. Because of this, the immune system breaks down. The symptoms most commonly associated with this virus are unexplained weight loss, fever and night sweats, and swollen lymph glands. JOHN DOES NOT HAVE AIDS, BUT HAS TESTED HIV POSITIVE. He is taking a drug called AZT, which is helping to keep the AIDS out of his system by preventing the virus from duplicating within his body. The way he manages to fight off any impurities is by exercising and keeping himself healthy, and EDUCATING HIMSELF.

John presently is not sexually active. He was involved in a 7 year relationship with a man who passed AIDS Awareness, continued, p.5

## Is Snow Removal Better During The Week?

This past Saturday morning, students woke up to the first substantial snowfall of the year. It shouldn't have been a big deal. But it was.

Unfortunately, the grounds crew did a poor job clearing off the sidewalks. They removed the top layer of snow, leaving a second layer to freeze.

On Sunday morning the problem became apparent. The snow had turned to sheer ice. Students had trouble keeping their balance as they walked on the sidewalks.

How much effort does it take to remove snow properly before it freezes? The grounds crew should have cleared and salted the sidewalks. If even one person had fallen as a result of the grounds crew's sloppy job, then legal complications could have resulted. More importantly, a Bryant student could have been injured.

Students in wheelchairs and on crutches were at a big disadvantage. They have enough problems maneuvering under good conditions, let alone icy conditions. Pledges (and other students) returning to their dorms late at night were also placed in a dangerous situation. They were unable to see the ice in their path.

In the past Physical Plant has scheduled grounds crews to clear off the sidewalks immediately after the snowfall had stopped. They have done an excellent job, both with clearing and salting.

Chances are, Physical Plant schedules less workers on the weekend. But that isn't an excuse for doing a less than acceptable job. Because of the large number of students who stayed on campus this past weekend, Physical Plant should have been even more concerned with doing a thorough job. Their failure to do this put many people in danger of injuring themselves.

However, the situation improved as the week progressed. The grounds crew meticulously removed the snow following Sunday night's storm.

Last weekend was an exception. However, the grounds crew's performance this week was respectable. Let's hope it continues.

# What Accreditation Means To The Bryant Community

The word "accreditation" enters many conversations around Bryant these days, whether the subject is admissions, class schedules, curricula, or whatever. It was even mentioned last year in an Archway column concerning the number of parking spaces on campus! In many ways, "accreditation" has become a shorthand term to describe the changes occurring at Bryant. Actually accreditation is only part of a major effort to reposition the College. I want to describe briefly what the accreditation effort is all about and then turn to the broader changes and how they will affect students.

First, Bryant College has been accredited for many years by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, one of several regional accrediting bodies that confer national accreditation on both secondary schools and colleges. The Bryant Board of Trustees decided several years ago to seek additional, specialized business accreditation from the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of business as part of the broader effort to enhance the character of the College. This specialized accreditation is enjoyed by only approximately 15 percent of the business programs in the nation.

Second, The College embarked at about the same time on broader efforts to enhance the character of the College. Some of these efforts relate to specialized accreditation. Others relate to the desires of parents and prospective students and to those of employers. Students will find these efforts reflected in curriculum requirements and in the classroom.

The new curriculum presents the arts and sciences and the

professional courses in a logical sequence with the professional courses concentrated in the junior and senior years. Instead of taking, for example, a marketing course as a freshman, the student has already completed courses in economics, statistics, and probably psychology or sociology. As a result, he or she has the background to enable the marketing instructor to devote the course time to marketing and not to



providing the elements of statistics or economics necessary to understand marketing.

The new curriculum offers more extensive and/or intensive coursework in communications, humanities, and the liberal arts. This change responds to the demands nationally by employers for graduates who possess not only strong technical skills in their majors but also the more general education necessary to advance and perform a variety of jobs. Bryant students are more fortunate than those at some traditional universities because the instructors

in these courses are interested genuinely in them as "their" majors rather than regarding them as the necessary evil of "those students from the business school."

Changes will be seen in the classroom as well. One of the major and expensive changes in our strategic plans is increasing significantly the percentages of our courses taught by full-time faculty. Although we will always employ some adjunct faculty who can bring unique and specialized talents to the classroom, the increased number of full-time faculty will mean increased access of students to their instructors on a regular basis for assistance and advice. We have hired 11 additional full-time faculty in the past two years and are seeking to hire another 11 this year. This change is not only quantitative. The new faculty bring with them not only demonstrated teaching skills but also research and consulting experience to expose students to the latest information in their fields. Addition of these faculty members facilitates the opportunities for incumbent faculty members to pursue professional development that should ensure their continued fine performance.

Physical facilities have not been forgotten. The Koffler Center is providing excellent computer access with professional assistance. Communications and language laboratories will offer additional enhancement to our programs.

These changes and many others are occurring daily. Like all changes, they may sometimes seem confusing or even inconvenient. However, they are changes designed to provide you with the best possible return on your investment. The changes and any confusion are short-term. But the return on your investment is long-term and high quality.

# Jobs With Japanese Companies

Q. Is it possible to get jobs with Japanese companies based in America? Would I need to speak Japanese?

A. Yes, there are opportunities to work for Japanese companies with subsidiaries based on the United States. An estimated half million Americans are currently doing so, and that number is projected to grow rapidly in the 1990's.

The opportunities exist in financial services firms, trading companies and manufacturing companies, among others. The financial service companies have traditionally been most open to advancement of American managers, but the need for American manufacturing managers is growing

quickly as more and more Japanese manufacturers located here, due to the current dollar/yen ratio.

These companies will also need employees with expertise in sales and marketing, functions the Japanese are not traditionally strong in.

Some of these companies require managers to speak some Japanese, but many others do not. It's to you advantage to pick up whatever Japanese you can, as well as international experience; but many companies will look at skill areas first, and then offer free classes in Japanese to valuable employees.

Other qualifications that may be more important than language fluency are adaptability, patience, interpersonal skills, and a willingness to start at the bottom and work on teams. A calm, non-egotistic generalist would be more

suited to a Japanese firm than an entrepreneurial star. An interest in Japanese culture would also be helpful.

The turnover of American managers in Japanese firms is fairly high. Those who leave tend to complain about slow career advancement, language barriers, comparatively lower pay, long hours and a heavy emphasis on teamwork. In some Japanese companies Americans are still barred from the top positions, although this practice is gradually changing.

On the positive side, Americans in Japanese firms tend to find greater commitment to employees and therefore more job security. The atmosphere in Japanese companies tends to be cooperative and free of office politics, with an emphasis on long-range thinking and product quality.

## A Day of Unity Celebration

On Sunday, February 26, 1989, an event of overwhelming substance occurred on Bryant College's campus. The event was a first for Bryant - a Black History Celebration sponsored by the Minority Business Student Association (MBSA). An invitation was extended throughout the college community to share in this day of celebration.

The day began with the showing of the film "A Legacy of a Dream," in Nick's Place at one o'clock in the afternoon. "A Legacy of a Dream" is an astounding account of the ministrations that Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. went through to overcome racial prejudice by the use of non-violent demonstrations. The film talks of the struggle Black Americans have gone through and to some extent are still fighting for in establishing equal rights.

The film also depicted the emergence of Black leadership in America's politics. An example of the leadership is shown in Andrew Young, former congressman to the 5th district of Atlanta, Georgia. Rep. Young spoke of his role in working for the betterment of all people, not just blacks. An important message that was relayed throughout the film was that "you can turn your back on me, but you can't turn your back on justice."

The evening festivities began at seven o'clock in the North Dining Room. At this time, students were introduced to Miss Ladjamaya Green, a speaker of tantamount proportions. Ladjamaya's, as she like to be known, style of speaking warrants the highest form of praise. The message that was received by those of us who were assembled within the North Dining Room, shall never be forgotten. Ladjamaya, with the use of words by such black

authors as Langston Hughes, Alice Walker, Richard Wright, and the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., took us on a journey that lead us to visualizing not a world filled with hunger, war, and pain but to a world that was filled with complete love, harmony, and peace. A world, which for those of us gathered together there, was easily brought to the forefront. "Close your eyes. Think. Do you see it? I do. For this world and the role you partake in it, is

## Who Are Stress Resistant People?

A recent study identified "Stress-resistant" people as those who have developed specific methods for coping with stress. This seems to be reflected in the incidence of illness being lower for these successful problem solvers.

Their strategies were as follows: 1. They tended to maintain reasonable personal control in their lives and looked for resources to find a solution to a problem;

2. They were committed to a goal of some kind, such as completing a college education;

3. They used a minimum of "substances", such as alcohol, caffeine, and nicotine;

4. They actively relaxed for at least 15 minutes each day day reading, meditating and so on;

5. Most engaged in regular aerobic exercise;

6. They were actively involved with other people, in other words, they had friends.

This study suggested that people who are sick less often had effective ways of dealing with problems, and took good care of themselves physically and emotionally. For more information stop by Health Services in Dorm 6.

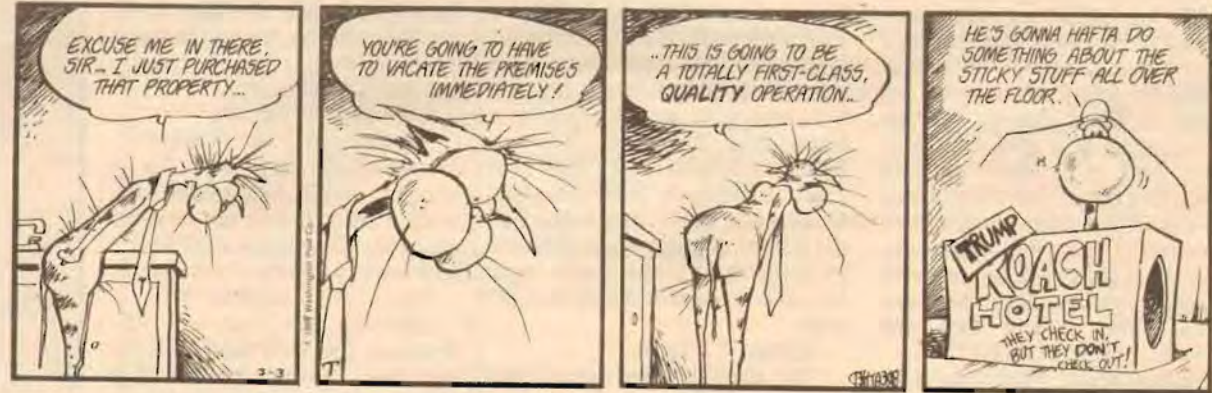

away a year ago from a non-AIDS related incident. He mentioned to a very interested audience that if he was infected, he would inform his partner. Unlike some other AIDS victims that are isolated and alone, John is getting a lot of SUPPORT and love from his friends and family. "This love," said John, "is what

keeps me going." When asked how he felt when he was diagnosed HIV positive, he mentioned that he was "devastated", and that "he could not eat or sleep for 2 days." On a more humorous note, he mentioned that he "smoked a cigarette with his doctor."

What John pointed out is that there

is AIDS and that there is AIDS RELATED COMPLEX (ARC) which is a less severe form of AIDS, but just as deadly.

When asked how this has affected his life, he replied: "It has made me appreciate my life, my friends, and my family so much more."

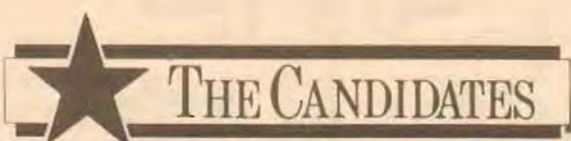

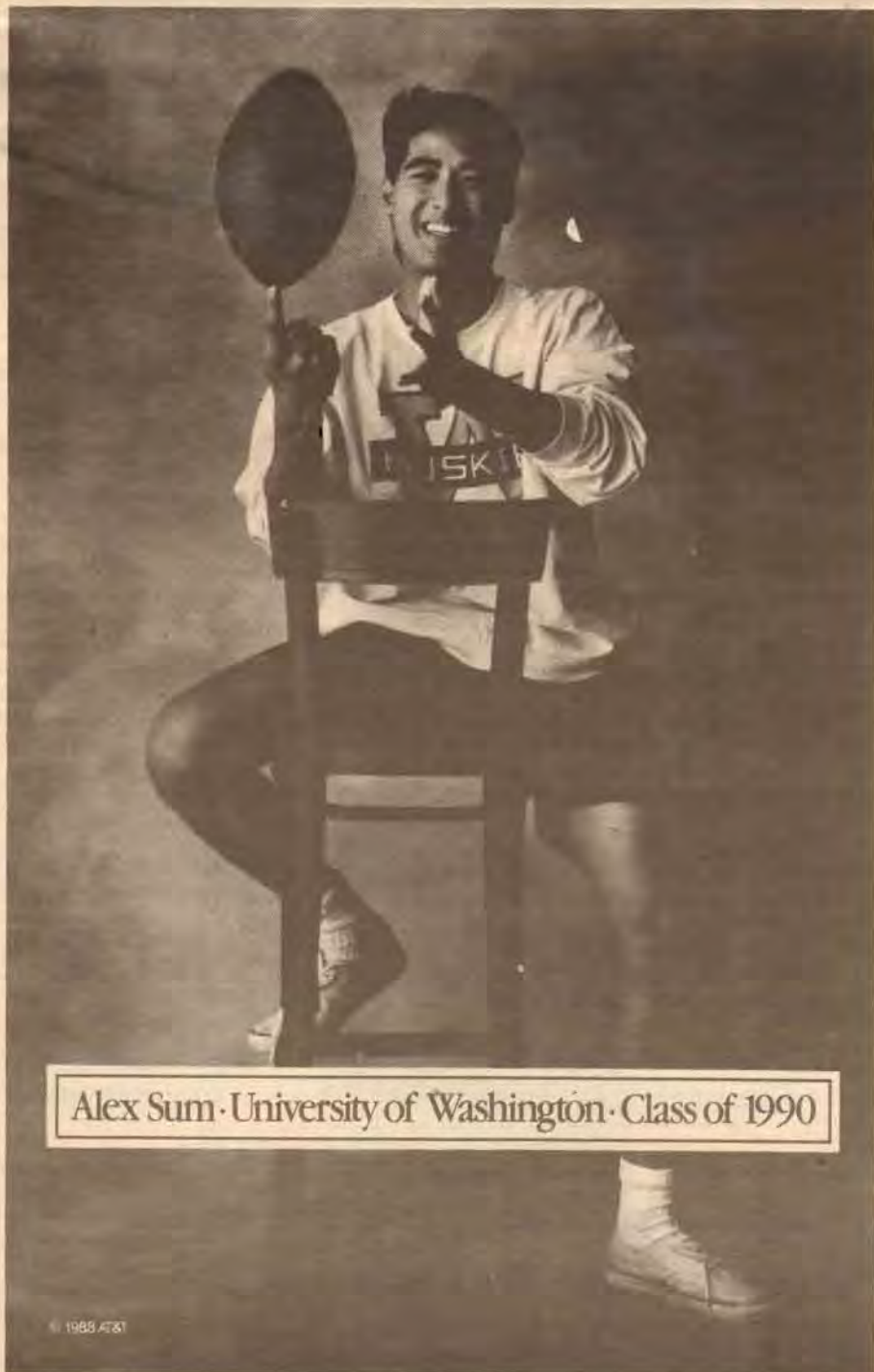

## The NCAA Question

Continued From P. 16

discriminatory? Wake up people! Here's how the rule should read:

1). All incoming freshman MUST have either a minimum 2.0 entering GPA and/or minimum 800 combined SAT score to be eligible for intercollegiate varsity participation. If these requirements are not met, then it is the school's responsibility to see that the athlete has achieved a minimum 2.0 cum by the end of his/her freshman year.

2). The athlete will be allowed to practice with the varsity squad, however, participation in an NCAA

sanctioned varsity event will be prohibited.

3). Academically ineligible athletes will qualify to receive scholarship awards from the university for their freshman year. If the athlete has failed to meet the minimum academic requirements at the end of his/her freshman year, it is the university's decision as to whether or not to continue the athlete's scholarship.

It may not be the best system in the world, but it sure beats the heck out of the current system.

## What's The NCAA Trying To Do?

There are those who would say Proposition 48 is necessary to whip college sports back into shape, and should stay in its current form. To them I say horse-hockey! On the other hand, I don't agree with Georgetown basketball coach John Thompson who asserts that Proposition 48 in any form would be a racially biased program. In purely theoretical terms, this Prop. was designed solely to protect the already damaged academic integrity of intercollegiate sports. But before I go any further, why don't we take a quick look at what Proposition 48 says.

In its current form, as ratified by the NCAA Rules Committee in 1988, Proposition 48 deals specifically with freshmen

scholastic eligibility. It states that to be eligible for play in an NCAA sanctioned varsity sport, all entering freshmen must have either a minimum 2.0 high school GPA and/or a minimum 800 combined score on the SAT exam. As well as revoking varsity status for those not meeting the academic requirements, the NCAA took it upon itself to deny these students scholarship funds for the entirety of their freshman year. ## Tackling The Steroid Problem
