# Student Senate Elections - 1965-1966

CAMPAIGN RULES

I. Office Requirements to be compiled with by those seeking election as Student Senate officers.

A. The candidate seeking the office of the President must have two semesters' attendance at Bryant College before taking office. The candidates seeking sub-offices must have one full semester's attendance at Bryant College before taking of-

B. Each candidate seeking Student Senate office must have a 2.3 scholastic standing.

C. Each candidate for Student Senate office must have seventyfive (75) signatures from the student body on a petition endorsing his candidacy.

D. The candidates' petitions March 1965 at 12 noon.

E. No candidate for a Student Senate office may be a member of the election committee nor may he be a member of a campaign committee and still be a member of the Election Committee.

II Campaign Material.

A. Posters.

1. Each candidate will be allowed two (2) large posters or banners and ten (10) 24 x 36" (maximum size) posters on campus at any one

2. Each slate of candidates will be allowed three (3) large posters or banners and twelve (12) 24 x 36" (maximum size) posters on campus at any one time.

B. Fliers.

1. Fliers (i.e., any printed matter on paper designed only to be read and can be classed as handouts) are NOT permitted.

2. Name cards, match packs, book marks, and similar useable material will not be considered as complaint. fliers.

C. Posting of Banners and Post-

1. No notice or sign of any type may be posted anywhere on College property without prior approval by the Director of Student Activities or a member of the Election Committee. This approval should be indicated, wherever practical, by initialing the notice. This rule is excepted in the case of extremely large signs and/or banners. In these cases a draft of the sign or hanner should be submitted for approval.

2. No notices or signs may be posted on the Painted walls of a

3. No notices or signs may be

placed on the bulletin boards. 4. Approved notices, signs and banners may be placed on woodwork in designated areas with masking tape or Scotch tape. This restriction includes all signs, regardless of Size. Banners may be attached in any manner that will not deface the area on which it is hung.

5. All notices must be hung on College property.

6. Posters will not be hung on on April 9, 1965. trees or wooden fences.




