

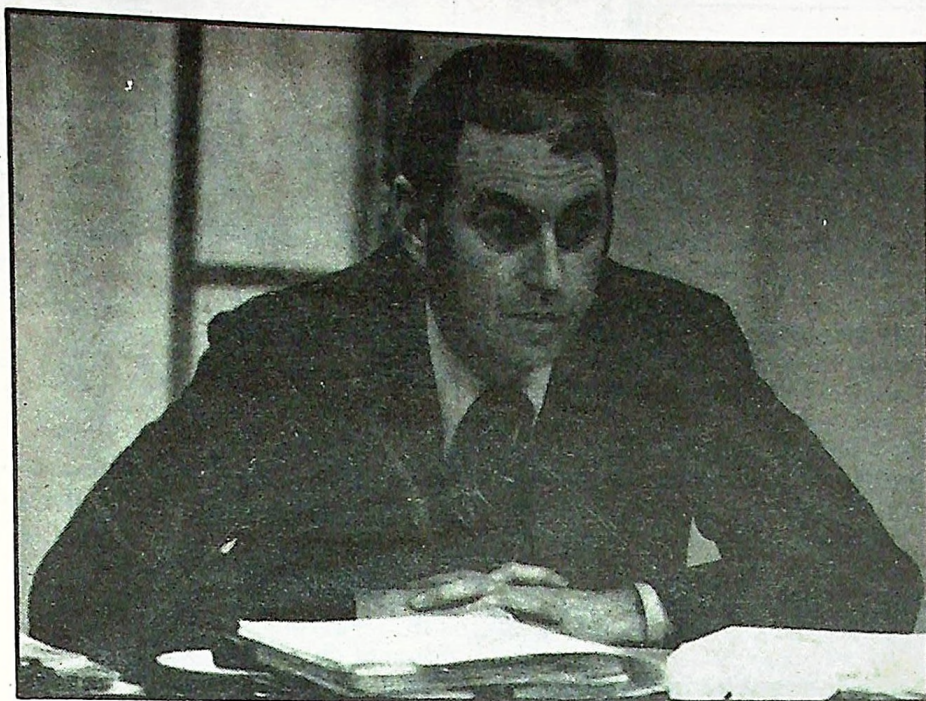
O'Hara Accepts Government Position

Dr. William T. O'Hara today announced that he is resigning his position of president of Bryant College effective April 17, 1981. Dr. O'Hara has accepted an offer to become Under Secretary of Commerce in the Reagan Administration. He will assume his government responsibilities the following Monday.

The Bryant College Board of Trustees, in a special meeting this past Thursday, accepted Dr. O'Hara's resignation "with regret." The Board has yet to formulate an official timetable for the replacement of the President. The Trustees also announced a "Farewell Wine and Cheese Reception" for O'Hara. The reception, planned for Thursday, April 9, will be held in the Faculty Dining Room from 2:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

As Undersecretary of Commerce, O'Hara will be the second ranking official in the Commerce Department. His responsibilities will include heading a newly formed task force on Commerce Dept. Budget Fraud. Dr. O'Hara will also head the Public Telecommunication Facility Grant Program, the Statistic Compilation Services Division and the Overseas Trade Commissions for Ghana, Canada, Chad, Sudan, Sri Lanka, Brazil, El Salvador, and Laos.

controversial debate about the salary of Bryant's chief executive. Certain factions contend that the salary figure should be made public because it is the student who pays it and

they deserve to know. The College's official position has always been one of silence. There has been no indication as to whether the salary will be announced at some time in the future.

The President's announcement was made at a mid morning press conference yesterday. After the official business was covered, O'Hara began chatting informally with those present. He said he "would be sad indeed to leave Bryant. Both my wife and I love Rhode Island and our rural Smithfield residence in particular." Asked whether he will miss all the little 'perks' of the presidency including a ride to work in the 'Security-Mobile', O'Hara jokingly responded that he "would miss the ride but not Bob's rough driving."

Dr. O'Hara kidded about graduating a year late saying that he'd stayed "five years but the fifth and final was certainly enjoyable. I believe it is called senioritis."

He asserted that his five years have been filled with progress for Bryant. "The College has taken major steps in the right direction. We've seen the construction of some needed buildings we've also seen the number of applicants rise every single year and their SAT's increase on average as well. Our organizations have also progressed considerably. WJMF is the most obvious example. With the College's full support WJMF has seen dynamic growth in the past 5 years."

O'Hara finished the news conference on a humorous note. He joked that his wardrobe will fit right in on the now conservative Capital. He has tentative plans to purchase a western outfit, however.

Financial Aid Budget Trimmed

The College announced yesterday that "The financial aid program will be trimmed by 1.1 million dollars for the academic year 1981-82." The announcement was made by Vice President for Business Affairs, Alton Mott with the grim faced Financial Aid Director at his side.

"The move is in response to a number of developments and is entirely reasonable," said Vice President Mott. "First, the College seen a steady increase in applications and therefore an increase in the number of students that can afford tuition without financial assistance. It is simply a matter of supply and demand."

"The second development," continued Mott, "is that the college wants to keep pace with the new spirit in Washington. There is an emphasis on cutting waste and fraud in programs. We applaud and embrace that philosophy. The truly needy will not be harmed," said Mott in a comment reminiscent of recent Reagan's speeches.

Student reaction was decidedly negative. "They raise tuition and cut financial aid, what are we supposed to do?" lamented one student. Another said, "They call it a trimming, I call it a massacre." One student we talked to was disappointed but to her the solution was obvious. "Moms will just have to get a second job."

The announcement was made at this early date to give students a chance to seek extra Summer jobs or make plans for next September.

New Alcohol/Housing Reforms Announced

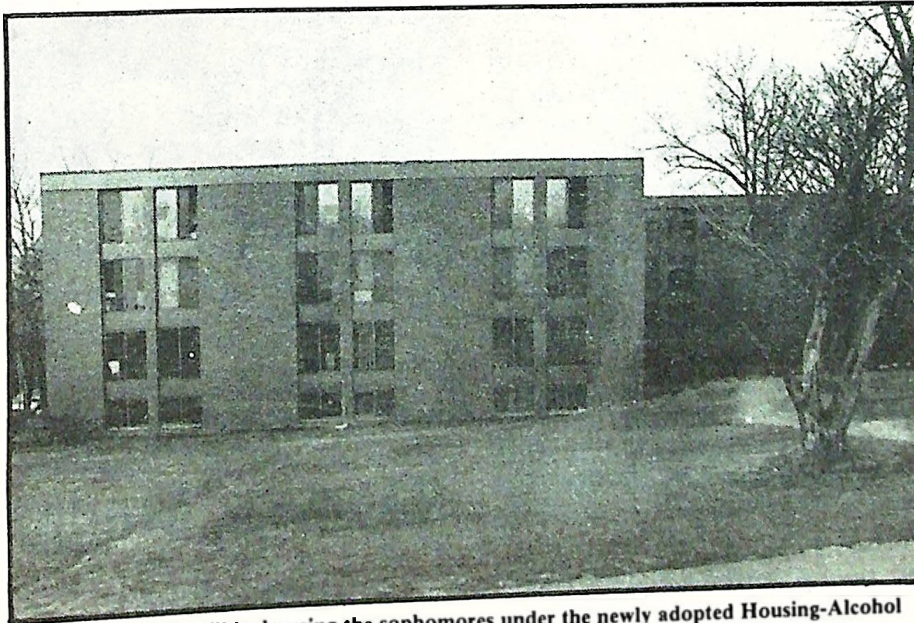
In order to combat problems which will be caused next year when the legal drinking age rises to 20, the Office of Residence Life in conjunction with the Alcohol Policies and Procedures Committee has devised a plan to take care of the problem nicely.

The basic tenet of the new housing reassignment plan is "If you are over the legal drinking age, the closer you will live to campus drinking establishments," according to Mr. Peter Barlow, Director of Residence Life. Students should expect to be reassigned starting next week.

Therefore, next fall, all Seniors will live in Dorms 1, 2, 3, and 4, regardless of sex (this particular location is closest to the Country Comfort). Juniors will be reassigned to Dorms 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, closest to the Pub. Sophomores will be forced to move to Dorms 10, 11, 12, 13, and the top two floors of the New Dorm, and Freshmen will be moved to the bottom two floors of the New Dorm and the Townhouses. This should keep undergrads well away from the evils of drink.

In addition, an electrified chain-link fence will be constructed stretching across the Dormitory Village and the Residents Parking lot to deter pesky little undergrads from getting near their favorite liquid libation.

Mixed suites of different classes will be asked to split up and form new suites with other displace residents, groups of 6 will be placed immediately, while groups of less than 6 will be ignored. While Residence Life is aware of the "slight inconvenience" of having

to go through housing sign-ups again, especially during preregistration, the office feels that the benefits, "will go a long way towards solving the alcohol abuse problem on campus."

When asked about the plan, Mr. Barlow commented, "This new plan fits in well with our previously adopted policies."

Students seemed to be generally displeased with the program. Especially disgruntled are

the sophomores who will end up spending another year in the New Dorm, and Seniors who were looking forward to a year in the Townhouses. Said one rather livid Junior, "I've been waiting three years to get into a *c*c*c% Townhouse and now this happens. I haven't been so *c*c*c% since I had a prereg number of 362."

As soon as Mr. Barlow touches base with les, reassignment will begin.

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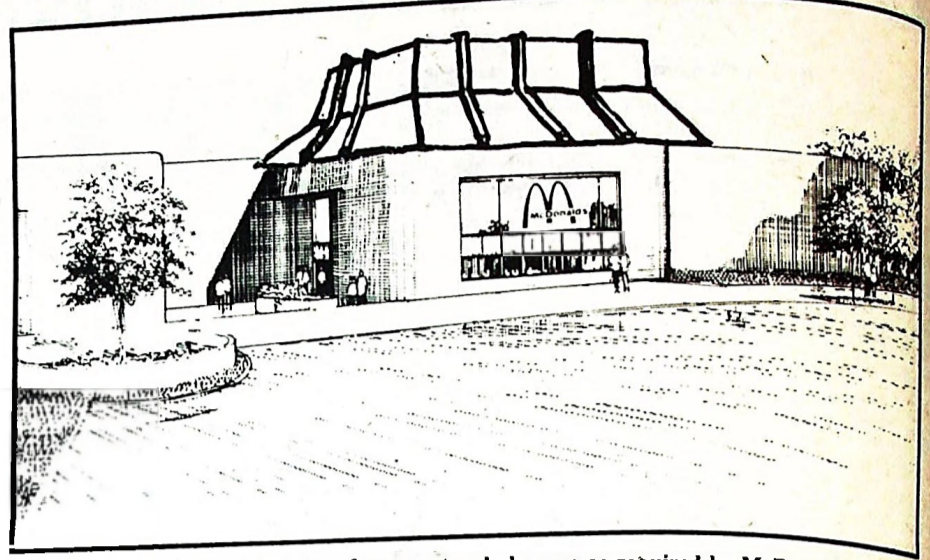

McDonald's To Donate 17.5 Million

V.P. Succumbs To Explosion

Bryant College lost another administrator this week as Vice President for Business Affairs, Alton Mott met an untimely death yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Mott paying a short visit to The Aachway office Tuesday afternoon about 2 p.m., and as he was passing by the newspaper's Comp/Set 500 typesetting machine, it suddenly exploded, killing Mr. Mott, but miraculously leaving the machine's operator unharmed.

The Aachway staff expressed extreme shock at such an occurrence. According to one unnamed staff member, "I had no idea that our typesetting machine was in that bad a condition. If we had known, I'm sure we would have submitted a proposal for its replacement."

This was the second time in two weeks that a piece of equipment started to act up in Mr.

Mott's presence. Just last week, as Mr. Mott was making a final inspection of WJMP's Unistructure Broadcast Center pending forthcoming renovations, the transmitter, which is still located there, started to spit sparks unexplainably at the Vice President, ultimately exploding a crystal. All the student organizations may combine interest and ask for it to be converted to a

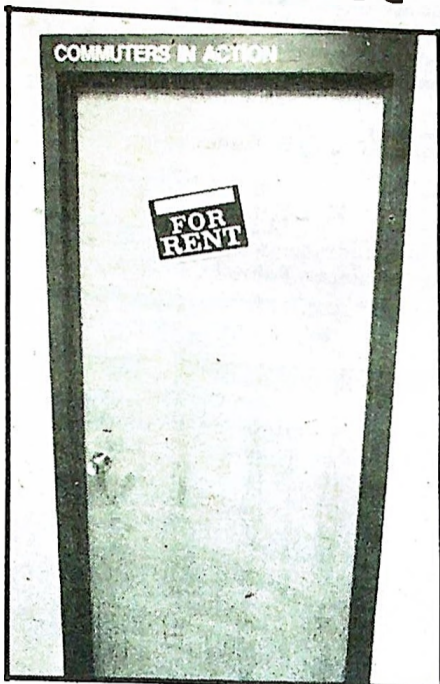

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Bookstore Convicted of Monopoly Conspiracy

On March 29, 1981, The Bryant College Bookstore lost the anti-monopoly suit it has been battling for the last two months. The case, which was heard in the Rhode Island State Supreme Court, was decided in favor of the plaintiffs, the Bryant student body. The student body was represented by several upper classmen who are majoring in pre-law. Charges brought before the court ran from the monopolizing of health care items and text books to charging exorbitant prices on clothing which carried the Bryant emblem.

Although the judgement was in favor of the student body, a few of the attorneys felt cheated. "I don't think it should have taken this long to convict the store. We had all the facts we needed and yet we had to wait," said the representative of the students who wished to remain anonymous. Speaking to one of the employees in the bookstore, we were told that most employees were not surprised by the verdict. They were only surprised that they got away with this for so long before someone finally spoke up.

Yesterday, the bookstore announced that effective April 2nd, all prices will be cut 50% as part of the primitive damages awarded by the court for the illegal activities that went on for the last ten years. With this case finally closed, the Law Enforcement majors will now begin their own investigation into the rumors that the bookstore is Mafia owned and operated. 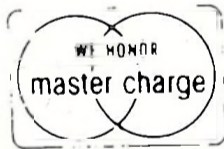

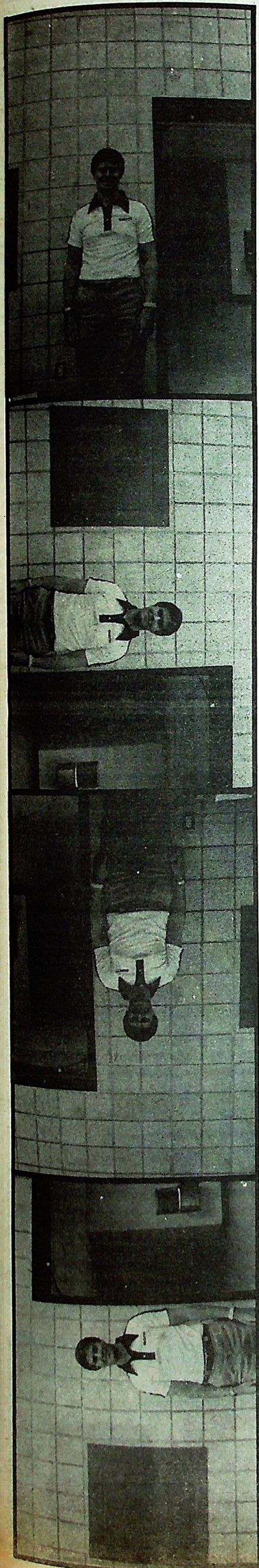

Car Takes Revenge On Commuter

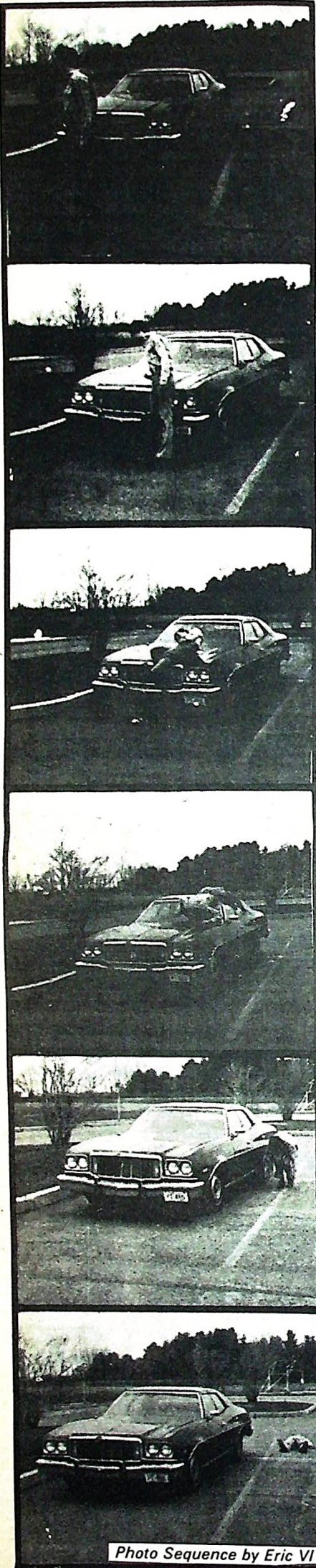

A. Only in cases of extreme dexterity, this however is a method that should be attempted by persons who are both highly motivated and well skilled.

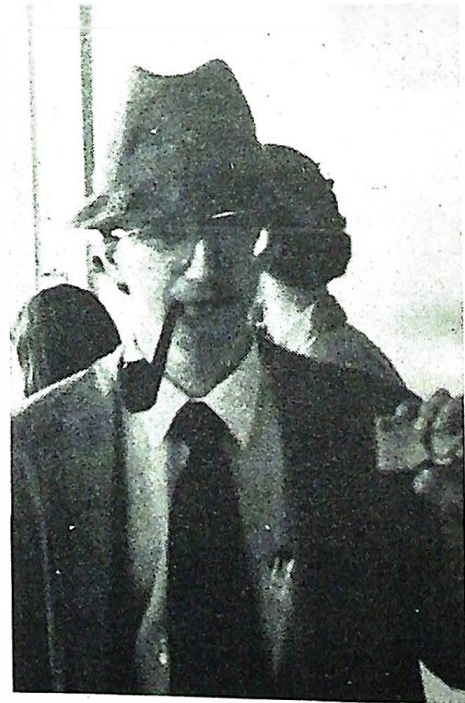
